

There are 32,369,477 acres of farm land in Nebraska There are 14, 655,687 acres in Nebraska under cultivation.

There are 904,285 horses and mules in Nebraska. (It takes 5 acres of ground each year to raise feed for each horse or mule).

There are 4,521,425 acres of cultivated land devoted to feeding horses and mules in Nebraska.
