COUNCIL PASSES LAW TO REGULATE USED CAR SALES

New Measure to Become a Law First of September: Dealers Must Have License.

The city council has passed an ordinance regulating the purchase and sale of used automobiles, parts or accessories, and regulating the storage of automobiles in public and private

This new measure will become effective on September 1. Mayor Smith, who has an interest in the successful operation of this regulation, has prepared an abstract of the ordinance as follows:

ordinance as follows:

1. Any person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of buying or selling second-hand cars, parts or accessories must first obtain a license.

2. The licenses shall keep a book in which shall be plainly written in ink or indelible pencil the name and address of the person from whom a used car is purchased; the model and type of the car, the name of the manufacturer, and if the same is indicated on the car the manufacturer's number.

3. In case of the purchase of acquisition of parts or accessories, the record shall show the name and address of the person from whom perchased, and the description of the size, make and the name of the man;

from whom perchased, and the description of the size, make and the name of the manufacturer of the parts.

4. A report shall be made to the chief of police on or before 10 o'clock a. m. each day on blanks to be furnished by the city, showing all matters required to be kept in the book or record above described, since date of last report. Blanks on which to make such report will be furnished by the city clerk, and it is the duty of the licensee to apply for and receive such blanks.

5. No licenses shall purchase any used motor vehicles, or parts or accessories, from any person in an intoxicated condition, or from any person under 21 years of age.

6. No used or second-hand motor vehicle, or parts or accessories, may be sold by such licensee for a period of 48 hours after the purchase or acquisition thereof shall have been reported to the chief of police as provided by this ordinance, unless written consent from the chief of police is given.

7. A violation of any of the foregoing provisions shall subject the party to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 and on conviction of a second offense, the license may be cancelled.

On Storage of Cars.

On Storage of Cars,

1. Any persons operating a garage for storing second-hand or used motor vehicles, must first obtain a license from the city clerk.

inust first obtain a license from the city clerk.

2. A record shall be kept of all cars stored for more than 48 hours. This record shall give the name and address of the person storing the car, the license number and state issuing the same, the model and type of the car, the name of the manufacturer, and the motor number.

3. A report shall be made by such licensee to the chief of police on or before 10 o'clock of each day, except Sundays and legal holidays, on blanks to be furnished by the city clerk, of all matters required to be shown in the book or record above referred to, since date of last report. These blanks will be furnished by the city clerk and it is the duty of the person operating the garage o' receiving cars in storage to apply to the city clerk for these blanks.

4. Violations of any of the provisions of the ordinance may be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00, and upon conviction of a second offense, the license may be cancelled.


