

OMAHA INDIANS SENT EAST FOR MUNITION WORK

One Hundred and Fifty to Be Sent to Nitro, West Virginia, for Work in Plant There.

A further draft upon men engaged in nonessential industries and men engaged in no industries is to be made by the federal, state and city cooperative employment bureau under instructions just received from Washington, stating that 1,000,000 men are needed in essential industries. Of this number, Nebraska is called upon for 8,180 men to be supplied within the next two or three weeks. Since May, says George Klefner, state director, the local office has sent more than 8,000 men of Nebraska into war industries outside of this state, wherever they have been called for. There is a tremendous demand for common labor in the shipbuilding and munitions plants of the east. Next Saturday 150 Indians will be shipped from Omaha to Nitro, W. Va., to work in a big munitions plant. At present there are 358 local jobs awaiting men at the bureau. These are exclusive of railroad jobs or jobs for women. Sixty positions were filled by the bureau on Thursday and 45 new demands for men were made on the bureau.

Modern Subjects Will Be Added to Course of Study at High School

Modernization of the Central High school will be put into effect when the school opens Tuesday, September 3. All subjects taught will be rearranged in such a way as to bear a direct relationship to present world events, according to Principal J. G. Masters. A special course, "The Great War," will be given for one semester. About six weeks of the course will be devoted to studying the causes and origin of the war. Part of the daily period will be used to study the latest developments on the battle fronts. The modernization will chiefly affect history, literature and debating. "A League of Nations" will be proposed as the subject for debate. Nebraska teams next winter.

Youths Who Register Must Fill Out Blanks at Once

Twenty-one-year-old youths who register for military service Saturday are urged to be accompanied by their dependents if they have any, as they will be given questionnaires immediately after registering and will be asked to fill them out at once and, in cases where there are dependents, the dependents must sign also to certain clauses in the questionnaire. Registrants who observe Saturday after Sabbath will be permitted to register on Monday according to information just received from Washington.

The first person to be converted when he entered evangelistic work several years ago, and the last person converted before he quit to enter war work last year, were found Thursday in the "killed in action" casualty list by Dr. Hugh A. Knowles, former evangelist, who is here directing the Salvation Army war work campaign for \$60,000. The former boy was John Maxwell of Forest City, Ill., and the latter, Dean Fry, of Miami, O. Dr. Knowles' son is in the company of Ohio engineers, of which Fry was a member.

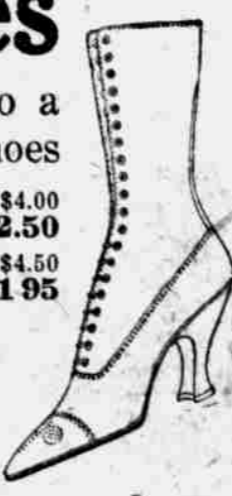
