Cattle—Wednesday's run was liberal, estimated at 400 cars, or 10,000 head, and trading was brisk on the part of the packers for beef offerings and prices strong to 10 to 15 cents higher than yesterday.

Good to choice steer sold largely from \$12.50 to \$15.00 and medium kinds from \$10.00 to \$12.00. Butcher stock was fairly active on heavy feeders early and fairly steady with yesterday. Medium kinds were slow, but about steady. Stockers and feeders were slow to open on a liberal supply, but the feeling was about steady. Much of the day's run was late in being yarded.

The few hogs on shipping market were sold largely at \$13.00 to \$15.00. The order market was a very slow affair, very little being done up to 2:45 p. m. when a little activity was noticed. Today's bulk is \$13.00 to \$15.00, with a few at \$12.00. The general market is slightly 10 to 15 cents lower than yesterday.

Sheep—There was another fairly large run of sheep here today, 134 loads, estimated at 35,000 head. Receipts for the week amount to 139,668 head. The feeders' lamb market is largely steady at Monday's prices, yesterday's top was \$12.50, with a fairly large steady, at \$14.75, and good lambs down to \$14.00, with fair lambs down to \$12.00. While prices look about steady there seems to be a little more activity in the trade. Aged sheep either fat or feeders show little change one way or the other.
