Arrangement Made for Sending of Food to Belgium and France

Arrangements have been completed for the relief of the 10,000,000 Belgians and French people now within territory occupied by the Germans, according to information coming from Herbert Hoover to Gurdon W. Wattles, federal food administrator for Nebraska.

To transport the great volume of foods across, the allied governments have placed 200,000 tons of shipping at the disposal of the relief commis sion, of which Mr. Hoover is chairman-this in addition to the vessels already controlled by the commis-

The food program, as outlined. will cost during the next twelve months \$280,000,000 for purchase and transportation. The financing has been arranged on the basis of advances to be made the Belgian and French governments by the United States, in amounts sufficient to pay for materials purchased here. England and France are advancing sums to cover purchases made in those countries.
