Packers Agree to \$18.50 Minimum Price for Hogs Washington, Oct. 3.—Although offering vigorous objection to the plan to stabilize the price of hogs recently proposed by a special investigating committee of the food administration, representatives of the large packing companies and about 40 smaller concerns today pledged their support to the food administration in the effort to maintain a minimum price of \$18.50 a hundred for hogs during the packing season.

People of Germany Still Trust Him, Says Kaiser Amsterdam, Oct. 4.—Responding to a demand for the establishment of a dictatorship in Germany, Herr von Berg, chief of Emperor William's civilian cabinet, has sent the following reply to the citizens of Hanover: "His majesty confidently expects in the present times that the entire German people will unanimously and trustfully support the kaiser and the empire and with its competent laborers pursue only the aim, making its blood and treasure free the fatherland from threatening dangers."

Soldiers in France Are to Plan Model Christmas Parcel With the American Army in France, Oct. 4.—(By Associated Press)—The Stars and Stripes, the official organ of the American expeditionary forces, has inaugurated a campaign to find the soldiers an ideal Christmas package within the official limitations. The men's suggestions will be cabled to the United States well before November 20, so that the sending of articles which are procurable in France will be obviated.

Red Cross to Send Thought Across Seas to Troops Washington, Oct. 4.—Red Cross chapters throughout the United States in their meetings and work shops will inaugurate October 23, observance of "the silent moment" when for one minute at the noon hour, according to a resolution adopted by the war council of the organization, all workers will concentrate their minds upon the soldiers and sailors over seas with whom they are working for their welfare.
