

### CATHOLICS ARE URGED BY HARTY TO HELP DRIVE

Should Contribute Generously to United War Work Fund, Says Archbishop of Omaha.

Catholics of Omaha are urged to liberally support the united war work drive which started Monday in a letter to the clergy and laity of the diocese by Archbishop-Bishop J. J. Harty. The letter will be read at all masses on Sunday and pastors are urged to supplement it with personal appeals for support of the big campaign. The letter follows: Omaha, Neb., Nov. 5, 1918. To the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Omaha:

The great united war work drive that is to provide funds for the comfort of our boys in the service of their country will begin on November 11. Seven organizations, acting under the War department commission on training camp activities, are promoting the recreational and moral welfare of our soldiers and sailors both at home and overseas. Instead of seven separate appeals to your generosity for this work, there is to be only one appeal on behalf of all the organizations engaged in war work.

The campaign is to be a joint movement carried on in every place by committees representing all the agencies devoted to war work. There will be a joint pledge card and subscriptions will be made to the united war work campaign, and not to any one organization. The Catholic war council, which includes all the war activities of the Knights of Columbus, is co-operating in the drive and a just share of the proceeds will be apportioned for Catholic work.

Catholics should co-operate in every way with the workers during the campaign, with regard to religious lines, and they should contribute generously toward the fund. There will be no distinct quota for Catholic parishes as such, but every Catholic should make it a point of honor to assist in making the drive a success. We should be even more generous than if appealed to for a fund raised and controlled entirely by Catholics, because now we must not allow ourselves to be outdone in generosity by others.

A year ago the people of Nebraska contributed most generously toward the Knights of Columbus war work fund. The work accomplished through your generosity and that of others will ever remain one of the brightest chapters in the history of Catholic effort in this country. You are asked to give again to further this noble work that is being done for our soldiers and sailors by the Knights of Columbus and other organizations. I appeal to the Catholics of the diocese of Omaha to support this great and necessary work for our boys in the service of their country. When solicitors for the united war work campaign call upon you be prepared to contribute to the limit of your ability. It is all for our boys from our own parishes, from our own homes, and surely, nothing can be too good for them. The spirit of America speaks in this appeal. Men of all creeds are working side by side receiving mutual respect, honor and assistance. These kindly dispositions may grow and spread and a closer union among all hearts prevail. Catholics should be foremost in generosity. Their hearty co-operation in this drive will be eloquent testimony to their friendly spirit towards their fellow citizens of all creeds.

Pastors will read this letter at all masses on Sunday, November 10, and will make appropriate comment urging their people to support the united war drive.
