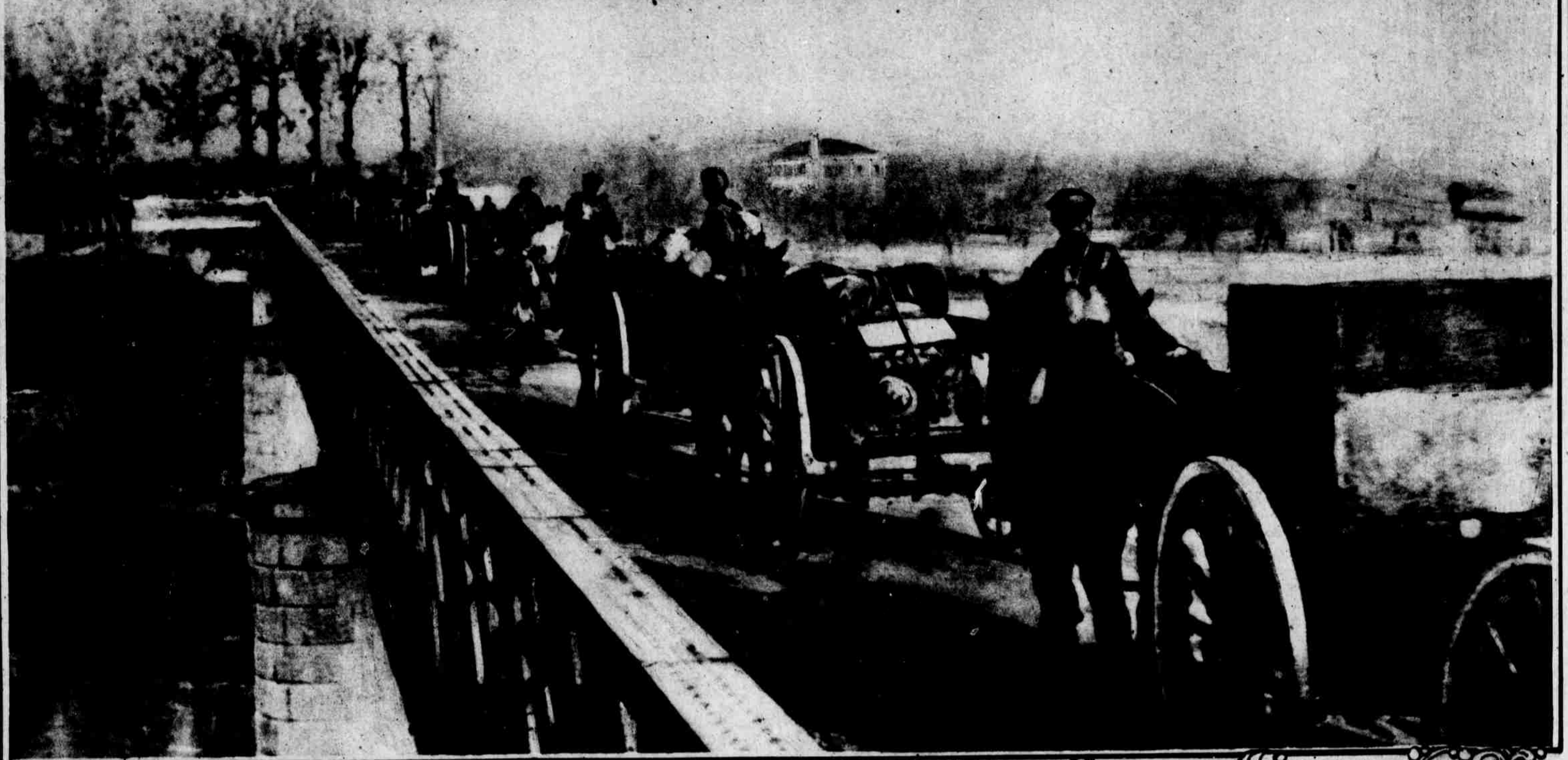
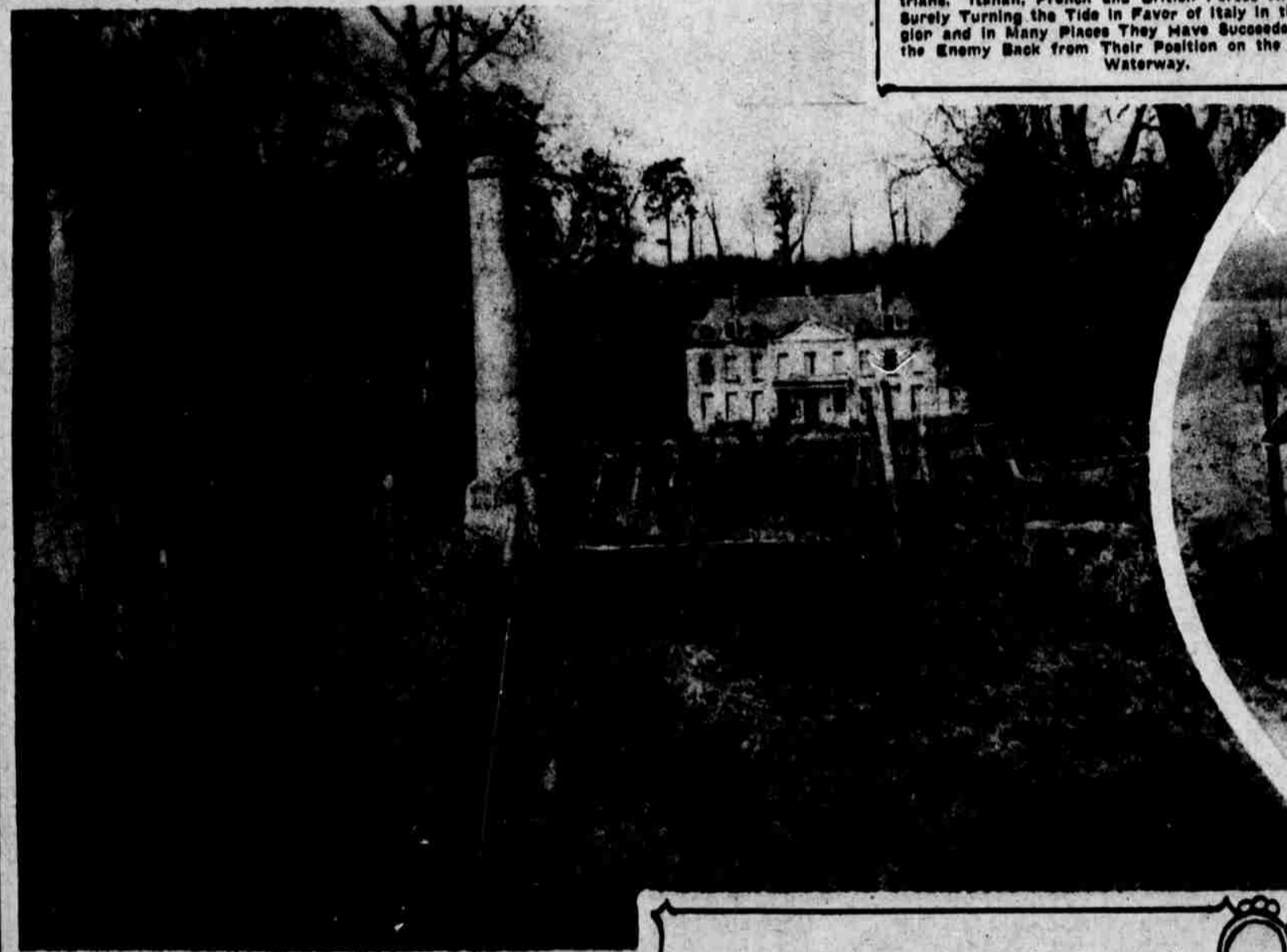


BRITISH ARTILLERY CROSSING THE FAMOUS PIAVE RIVER
