

## 13 COMMUNITY CENTERS OPEN HERE THIS WEEK

Schoolhouses to Be Meeting Places and Many Features to Mark Gatherings Each Week.

Thirteen community centers will be opened this week in school buildings throughout the city under direction of Vlasta Sterba recreation director. General assembly, gymnasium, dramatics and other features will mark these centers. There will be two or three meetings in each schoolhouse each week.

"Everybody in the community above the age of grade school children is invited to these centers," said Miss Sterba. "I want to impress that this is not a charity any more than the parks are a charity. The work is kept up out of city funds as the parks are kept up."

"The schoolhouse is to be the community capital where the neighborly spirit so essential for concerted action can be created by means of the general assemblies, concerts, social hours, dramatics and men's and women's classes in physical training and athletics."

**Loomis to Go to Washington in Supreme Court Case**  
N. H. Loomis, general counsel for the Union Pacific corporation, will go to Washington Sunday to appear in United States supreme court in a case sent up from the state courts of Missouri.

Some years ago when the Union Pacific was floating a bond issue, it was required to file with the proceedings incident to the issue in every state in which the company had any track. In Missouri it had one mile of main line track. The secretary of state of Missouri demanded a \$10,000 filing fee. It was paid under protest, after which proceedings to recover the sum were instituted. The case was tried in the state courts and the company won. On a retrial, a verdict was rendered in favor of the state. The case is now in supreme court on appeal.

**Week Beginning on Dec. 2 Named Conservation Week**

The program has not been outlined but it is understood people of the United States will be asked to conserve to the full extent of their ability, that we may offer all possible relief to the starving people of the world.

## May Hold Grand Ball For Omaha Soldiers Thanksgiving Night

In place of the Thanksgiving home dinner for every soldier for which the War Camp Community service would have arranged had it not been the request of Col. Jacob W. S. Wuest that the soldiers be allowed to remain at the fort on that day, a grand military ball is under consideration.

At a meeting of the committee on Thanksgiving entertainment, which F. P. Matthews is chairman held Saturday noon, it was decided to make immediate arrangements for the ball, to be held Thanksgiving evening. Locations are now under consideration. Plans will be made for the accommodation of at least 500 couples.

In addition to the ball, dinners at the home of Omaha people on the following Sunday for all the soldiers will be arranged for. Many have already applied for permission to entertain a soldier during the Thanksgiving season.

Colonel Wuest stated that the military cooks would provide such a feast on Thanksgiving day that more food could not be accommodated, and the committee believe a dance will promote proper digestion of this grand spread.
