The Saxonia carries casuals and 963 sick and wounded. The General Gorgas only 14 officers, seven en-listed men and one civilian. The Saxonia and Cedric sailed from England on December 14, and the General Gorgas and the Mongolia from France December 13.

A message from General Pershing added about 3,000 additional men to these designated by him for early return to the United States. The units are:


