**Butters Bound Over to District Court on a Charge of Delinquency**

Albert Butters, photographer in 1306 North Twenty-fourth street, was charged with aiding and abetting in the delinquency of children in police court today. He waived preliminary hearing and was bound over to the district court on a \$2,000 bond.  
The complaint was filed by Leo Rosenthal of the Jewish Welfare

board, who alleges that Butters aided in the delinquency of Rosie Lukaski, 2044 North Twenty-second street. The little girl is 13 years of age. Her father has been dead a month.  
Butters was bound over to the district court on December 31 on a \$2,000 bond. He was charged with having obscene literature in his possession. He pleaded guilty to this charge.  
Police allege that he is connected with a national organization, composed largely of photographers, who prey on the minds of the youth by the use of obscene pictures and literature.

**CZECHO-SLOVAKS STILL HOLD ALL FRONTS IN UFA**

Thousands of Russian fugitives joining organizations in Finland for offensive against Bolsheviki.

Washington, Jan. 3.—Czecho-Slovak and co-operating Russian troops are still holding all fronts in the Ufa region, according to information reaching the State department today. English armored trains and French troops were sent from Ufa to support the extreme fronts.

On December 26, a belated dispatch says, bolshevik forces broke through the line at Binsk, 25 miles from Ufa, but no red guards at that time had appeared at Ufa. Between the 26th and 28th of December the Siberian army at Perm had taken 31,000 prisoners, 120 guns, a large number of machine guns, 30 automobiles, nine armored trains and the entire bolshevik supply train. The entire loss of the red army, according to these advices, is estimated at 90,000.

The Russian commander in charge of the Siberian army was Lieutenant General Papiiev, 28 years old, a report reaching the State department today, resulted in a victory for the nonsocialist element, which gained a full majority of the municipal council.

Reports from Reval say Estonian ships, batteries in the villages of Kolga and Wakkio and detachments landed and cleared the peninsulas of Jumindan and Aperispea.

**Man Who Robbed Baggage Sentenced to State Prison**  
North Platte, Neb., Jan. 3.—(Special Telegram.)—Chester M. Smith, who was arrested several weeks ago for robbing a U. P. baggage car of which he was in charge and claimed that he had been struck with an iron bar and robbed, pleaded guilty of the theft in district court this week and received a sentence to the penitentiary of from one to seven years. Smith is 21 years of age and was a resident of Eddyville.

**Norfolk Boy Reported Killed in Action, Oct. 8**  
Norfolk, Neb., Jan. 3.—(Special Telegram.)—Henry Winter of Norfolk, who was reported missing in action October 8th, is reported in an official telegram today as having been killed in action.

**Iowan Honored by Gideons.**  
Chicago, Jan. 3.—Announcement of the election of A. B. T. Moore of Cedar Rapids, Ia., as national secretary of the Gideon society was made here today.

**Council of Defense Handled Many Cases During Term of Office**

Lincoln, Jan. 2.—(Special.)—In closing its duties the state council of defense has prepared its report in which it sets forth the work performed during its term of office.

During the life of the council numerous cases of sedition and disloyalty on the part of alien enemies were dealt with. This was especially the case during the fore part of the war. These cases were principally mushroom socialists; foreign born people whose Americanization has been neglected; advocates of internationalism; clergymen of foreign birth and body, and many others who failed to adjust their thoughts and actions to the standard demanded of American citizenship. As the work of the council progressed the need of a more stringent sedition law became urgent, and such a law was passed at a special session of the legislature in April, 1918.

**Negro Bound to District Court on Murder Charge**

North Platte, Neb., Jan. 3.—(Special Telegram.)—Amos Bush, colored, who was arrested Sunday, charged with the killing of George Hill, also colored, at his preliminary hearing in the county court this afternoon was bound over to the district court without bond. Milton Brown, colored, who was arrested last week for stealing a \$700 diamond ring from rooms in the Liberty Inn, was tried this afternoon in county court and bound over to the district court on \$2,000 bond.

**Mexican Laborer Killed by Son of Fellow Workman**

North Platte, Neb., Jan. 3.—(Special Telegram.)—Eustilio Tene, a Mexican laborer of Hershey, was accidentally killed this afternoon by the 12-year-old son of a fellow laborer. They were preparing for a hunting trip and Tene had loaded a gun and handed it to the boy who was examining the trigger when the gun was discharged.
