

REGULATIONS BY GOVERNMENT IS CUYLER'S PLAN

Chairman of Railway Executives Offers Outline of Proposal for Private Ownership of Roads.

Washington, Jan. 9.—A comprehensive program for private ownership and management of railroads under strict government regulation was laid before the senate interstate commerce committee today by T. Dewitt Cuyler, chairman of the Association of Railway Executives, representing practically all leading roads in the United States.

The plan includes provision for merging systems, a large measure of unification of operation, pooling of facilities and, in certain cases of earnings, and in enforcement of adequate service under supervision of a secretary of transportation, a new cabinet office with the Interstate Commerce commission acting as a supreme court of review of rate disputes.

Wage Adjustment Board. Wage and employment disputes which could not be settled between employees and managements would be referred to an adjustment board within the department of transportation under the plan, and strikes and lockouts forbidden pending investigation.

The power of regulation, including all rates, state and interstate should be exclusively in the hands of the national government. State commissions should not be interfered with by the federal act except so far as necessary as to carry out the purposes herein mentioned.

No new or branch lines of railroad or large and expensive terminals should be constructed unless a certificate of public convenience and necessity is first obtained from the secretary of transportation.

The carriers should have power to initiate rates, schedules of which should be filed with the Interstate Commerce commission, with the secretary of transportation and with the state commissions in which the rates are applicable.

Offer McAdoo Aid. Railroad executives have pledged Director General McAdoo their cooperation and have urged him not to relinquish federal control until congress has had opportunity to legislate, Mr. Cuyler declared. He read a message he sent Walker D.

Mr. Cuyler explained that the association of Railway Executives represented 93 per cent of the railway mileage of the country, and including virtually all big lines except the Southern railway.

U. S. OPERATIONS TO HELP RUSSIA, SAYS HITCHCOCK

Senator States That American Troops Are in Disordered Land on a Friendly Mission.

Washington, Jan. 9.—American and allied operations in Russia are friendly and not hostile to the Russian people, although in opposition to German-bolshevik forces, Chairman Hitchcock of the senate foreign relations committee, said in an address today, replying to the recent demand of Senator Johnson of California, for an official statement of the American policy in Russia. "There is no Russia," he declared. "What was Russia is a vast disorganized aggregation of local governments."

Senator Hitchcock prepared his address after consulting with Acting Secretary Polk at the State department. After pointing out that seizure of the ports of Vladivostok, Murmansk and Archangel was proposed by the supreme war council to prevent Germany from obtaining valuable stores, he said:

"In each case it was done as a measure of war against Germany and not against Russia. In each case the local Russian government exists and functions with the American and allied soldiers."

Disorganized Aggregation. "There is no Russia. What was Russia is a vast disorganized aggregation of local governments. Lening and Troizky have the great cities of Petrograd, Moscow and some others, and thus have the center of the wrecked nation, but it is the most unhappy, most lawless, brutal and most bloody. Other parts of Russia are comparatively calm and orderly."

"We sent about 10,000 men to Vladivostok, the Pacific port, and about 5,000 to Archangel, the Arctic port in European Russia, and Murmansk, the port which leads to the Murnan coast."
