

# JOHN W. GAMBLE AGAIN HEADS OMAHA C. OF C.

### Thomas A. Fry Is Re-Elected Treasurer, While Clark C. Powell Again Fills Secretary's Position.

The recently elected board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce held their first meeting yesterday to elect the president, treasurer, secretary and executive committee for the coming year.

John W. Gamble, chairman of the executive committee for the last year, was elected president. Thomas A. Fry, treasurer, and Clark C. Powell, secretary, were re-elected to serve during 1919.

Mr. Gamble is 39 and one of the youngest men ever chosen for that position. He has been an active member of the Chamber of Commerce for the last eight years. He is known as an authority on river navigation, and one of the chief boosters for the development of waterways transportation on the Missouri river.

Mr. Gamble is president of the Standard Chemical Manufacturing company and a director in one or two other Omaha concerns.

Graduating from the Nebraska State Normal at Peru, and the Nebraska university, he went east to fit himself for the newspaper field, during that time making a study of sociology in New York and later traveling extensively as a special correspondent. However, he drifted from the literary field to the commercial, which landed him back in his home state. He is a member of the Ak-Sar-Ben board of governors, past president of the Omaha Manufacturers' association, Athletic club, University club, Salesman's association, Field club and the Seymour Lake club.

When asked where he was born, Mr. Gamble said: "In a little old log house down close to Springfield, Neb. I was down there a short time ago and they are using it for a granary now."
