"Part of our regiment took part in the St. Mihiel drive early in September and made quite a reputation. Meuse-Argonne sector, which was taken over by the first army at the request of General Pershing, was considered the most difficult section of the entire western front, owing to its natural deiensive advantages and positions, being very rough terrain-wooded and cut up by many river and creek

Cur regiments formed the road service of the first army. Our duties were to build, rebuild, repair wagons and maintain all highways in the whole sector, starting at the railheads and keeping in continuous touch with the ever-advancing front lines, so as to keep the traffic mov-ing both ways at the same time. Also we had to rebuild bridges and culverts. We hauled our own materials and tools, rations, gasoline and forage, and were self-supporting

A great deal of this work was done under artillery fire and we were close enough to duck bullets. but never for very long. We were at many times in advance of our own artillery, and always ahead of the 'heavies,' which were at times thirty files behind the front. There were places that could be worked only at night, being under direct enemy observation. Those boches sure knew the range to all points of the road-forks at five-mile range, and never miss it fifty yards. Also they mined the roads and bridges while in Omaha the other day, while in Omaha the other day. and blew them up as the doughboys advanced over them. 
