The market is to be open from June 1 to November 1 each year, daily except Sunday, from 5 a. m. to noon, and in the market house proper the stalls may be kept open

"Kills" Jackson Street Market During this period and during iese hours, the ordinance provides no fruits, vegetables or other goods sold in the public market, shall be sold or exhibited for sale in any other place in the city except in enclosed buildings. This section does away with the market maintained for many years at Eleventh and Jackson streets and other streets in the wholesale fruit and vegetable and produce district. It would even prevent these men from exhibiting their goods on the sidewalks in front of their places of business.

Collection of the stall rents is alotted to the license inspector. There shall be no discrimination against any purchaser," section 9 of the ordinance provides.

Any occupant of the public market found guilty of giving dishonest measure or practicing any other de-ception shall be denied the privileges of the market. Any violation of any provision of the ordinance is made a misdemeanor and a fine not to exceed \$100 is provided.
