

# MOTHER DIES AS SEEEKS IN VAIN SOLDIER SONS

## Ill and Alone, Aged Woman Finds Repose in Death That Was Denied Her During Life.

Unclaimed, unhonored—all that remains of Mrs. Louise Rusch Mohr, mother of two boys in the Rainbow division in France, lies in the Jackson undertaking establishment, awaiting burial by the Red Cross home service department.

Poor, sick, homeless and alone, the aged woman came from Lincoln Monday, seeking from the local Red Cross some word of her boys.

Exhausted Every Resource.

To Mrs. Richard Schuenemann, 1118 South Twenty-seventh street, who took her into her home, where she died Tuesday, the forlorn mother confided that though she had exhausted every resource, had written numberless times to the War department, she was without one word of information concerning the whereabouts of her boys.

Even the knowledge of whether they are dead or alive was denied her. By day she scanned the long

lists of casualties, her heart beating high with fear lest she come upon the names of her sons.

Dreamed of Sons.

Night brought no relief. Warswept battlefields on which her sons might be lying, pain-wracked hospital cots which might hold her boys—such dreams as these brought untold suffering to the little mother in all the dark days of the war.

When peace came, and with it no word from either of her boys, the little woman expressed the wish to come to Omaha to glean some information concerning her boys. But she knew no soul in the big city except Mrs. Schuenemann, whose mother in Lincoln she had nursed through a recent illness. In appreciation of the woman's service to her mother, Mrs. Schuenemann invited her to stay at the Schuenemann home while in Omaha.

But the excitement was too much. The hopes and fears of the news about to be vouchsafed her were too great. The brave heart broke. "Organic heart trouble" the death notice reads.

Long Nights of Suspense.

Seen in death, the features are those of a motherly-looking person—kindly-lined, but oh, so very tired! Tired of the long days and nights of suspense, waiting for a little word from her boys—tired of the hard days of work to eke out her living till her boys came home! The delicate-featured nose and mouth are those of a woman of evident refinement; the soft dark-brown hair tinged with silver. The only mark

on the face is a mole on the left side, near the chin.

What burial robe there will be, will have to be provided by the Red Cross, as the woman had scant effects and no money. A few letters written in German from that country in 1909, mention the name of one of her boys, Frederick, but give no further information as to possible relatives or friends.

Efforts Are Fruitless.

All efforts of the Red Cross home service department to trace relatives in Lincoln have proved fruitless. Unless some one who knew her recognizes the accompanying photograph taken in death, the body will be put to rest without a single sorrowing friend.

According to a state law, the body is the property of the state. Were it not for the Christian burial the Red Cross will give the body, if no one claims it, the remains of the mother who gave two sons to Uncle Sam could be used for dissection purposes.

### Foreign Exchange With the Russians to Be Stopped

Washington, Feb. 28.—Foreign exchange transactions between the United States and Russia have been prohibited by the federal reserve board and similar action has been taken by the authorities of Great Britain and France. It is understood that one purpose of the step is to stop the financing of bolshevik propaganda.

The reserve board, it became known today, acted at the request of the State department. Evidence was obtained, it is said, that large sums of money had been made available in the United States for use of bolshevik agents. Practically the only means of stopping this was to shut off these transactions.

### Tungsten Mines Closed.

Boulder, Colo., Feb. 28.—The managements of 18 tungsten mining properties in the Boulder district posted notices today that the mines would not open tomorrow and would remain closed for an indefinite period. Lack of a market as a result of the cancellation of war orders was given as a reason.

### Rioting in Munich.

Copenhagen, Feb. 28.—Rioting broke out anew in Munich on Thursday, according to the correspondent there of the Politiken. Three thousand Spartan soldiers marched to the Parliament buildings in an effort to force the diet to proclaim a soviet republic in Bavaria.

### "Vamp" Marriage, Claim of Kish in Divorce Case

Mrs. Kish alleges in her petition for a decree of divorce that she was deserted five days after her marriage and that Kish proposed that she should compromise herself for monetary gain. She is 19 years old.

### Prison Term Imposed for Stealing Automobile

Edward Burdick pleaded guilty yesterday afternoon before Judge Redick in criminal court to a charge of stealing an automobile. A sentence of one to seven years was imposed.

A similar sentence was imposed on Leon Taylor, who entered a plea of guilty to a charge of larceny as bail.

D. G. Sleeper, charged with passing worthless checks, was fined \$100 and sentenced one to five years on his plea of guilty.

Springfield, Ill., Feb. 28.—A nation-wide strike of electrical workers affiliated with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers is in prospect "unless President Wilson provides some committee, commission or court" to which members of the organization can submit grievances, according to Charles E. Ford, secretary of the brotherhood, following the sending of a telegraphic appeal to the president today.
