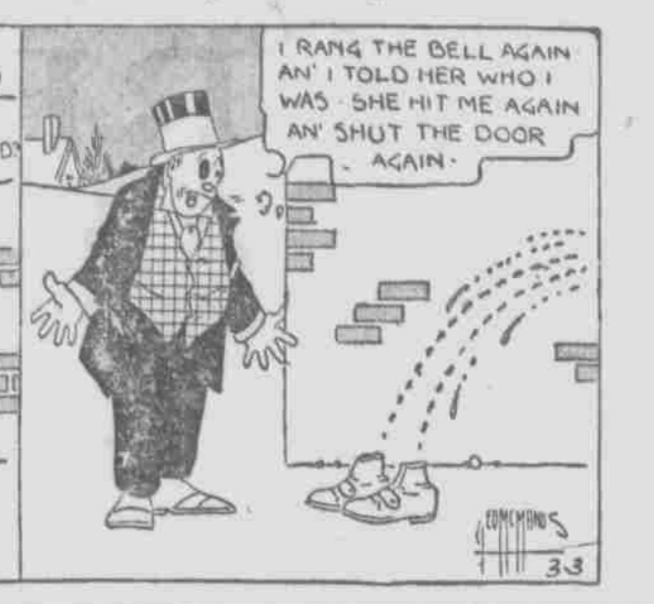

Noted Santa Monica Road Race to Be Held March 15

Santa Monica, Cal., March 2.—The Santa Monica road race, in former years a noted event in the automobile world, will again take its place in the sports of the southland on March 15 when a field of cars, expected to include two score of entrants, will leave the mark for 33 trips around a seven and six-tenths miles course, or a total distance of 250 miles.

The course this year is to be slightly shortened from that heretofore followed, and for the thousands who have viewed former races, and are familiar with the ground, it may be said that the cars will start south from in front of a grandstand to be erected on Eighth street, turn and go east on Wilshire to the "hairpin turn" at the soldiers' home.
