IMPRESSIONS OF THE KAISER. By David Jayne Hill. Harper & Brothers, \$2.00.

Former Ambassador Hill knows the Kaiser as few Americans have ever known him. During the years when he represented this country at Berlin he was in almost daily contact with either the Kaiser himself or with his ministers. And beyond this he has a full and scholarly knowledge of the background against which the world's greatest tragedy has been enacted. To denounce any man, however evil he may be, is as ineffective as it is easy. To let that man reveal himself through his own acts and words, is the more convincing method of showing the world what he really is. This is what Dr. Hill has done in these pages.

BRITISH-AMERICAN DISCORDS AND CONCORDS. Compiled by The History Circle. G. P. Putnam's Sons.

Here we have a summary of the relations between Great Britain and America during the three centuries which have elapsed since Englishmen first settled on the American continent. The statements in the text may be accepted as trustworthy, and will prove extremely interesting to the general reader.

ESSAYS AND ADDRESSES IN WAR TIMES. By the Rt. Hon. Viscount Bryce. Macmillan Company.

Following the three essays with which the book begins, are three addresses of a non-political character, treating of the war in general, its causes and some of its phenomena, its social effects, and its relation to human progress. The distinguished author says in his preface: "This is a war of principles, and the course of events has vindicated the principles of morality and humanity that were at stake."

THE FUTURE BELONGS TO THE FUTURE. By Karl Liebknecht. Macmillan Company, \$1.25.

The philosophy of Liebknecht as revealed in these pages leaves but a narrow ledge for heroes to stand on. To him the significant thing in history is and has always been, the stirring of the masses of men at the bottom, their unconscious writings, their struggles, and finally their gigantic, fearsome upthrust, which overturns all the little groups of clever men who have lived by holding these masses down. In his philosophy he is diametrically opposed to the theories of Carlyle, as summed up in the latter's "Heroes and Hero Worship."

FICTION.

GULLIVER'S TRAVELS. By Dr. Jonathan Swift. J. B. Lippincott Company, \$1.25.

On the island of Lilliput, upon which Gulliver was cast by shipwreck, dwelt a people so small that the most of them did not exceed six inches in height—indeed were beneath this stature. "Fifteen of the emperor's largest horses, each about four inches and a half high, were employed to draw me to the metropolis," wrote Captain Gulliver. In this land "like a garden," in which the fields resembled so many beds of flowers, Gulliver had many strange adventures, not the least of which was his prowess in carrying off 50 men-of-war of the enemy nation and thus saving Lilliput. But what were these events compared to his thrilling experiences in Brobdingnag, whether he traveled later? Where his 9-year-old nurse was "not above 40 feet high, being small for her age." It cannot be thought that any child's education is complete until he has mastered this most diverting history.

MISCELLANEOUS.

NERVE CONTROL AND HOW TO GAIN IT. By H. Addington Bruce. Funk & Wagnell Company, \$1.

A very sensible and practical discussion of the whole question of nervous troubles and their causes in a chatty, non-technical manner that will appeal to the laymen the author designs to help. The book treats of foods, exercise, and habits in their bearing on the nervous condition of the individual; of irritability, worry, timidity; the value of the right outlook, the blessings of relaxation, the curative quality of fresh air, and a host of other phases of this most important subject. Every man or woman who is nervous should make a point of reading this book, which can not fail to be of real assistance to those who take its advice to heart.

HOW TO PREVENT SICKNESS. By G. L. Howe, M. D. Harper & Bros., \$1.

Here is advice by an expert who is medical director of the Eastman Kodak company. He states that more than half the diseases in the world might be prevented, and gives proven facts, enabling the reader to take sensible care of himself. It is a book that anyone might read and follow with profit.

EUROPEAN THEORIES OF THE DRAMA. By Barrett H. Clark. Stewart & Kidd Company, \$2.50.

Nowhere else is so important a body of doctrine on the subject of the drama to be obtained. It cannot fail to appeal to anyone who is interested in the theater, and will be indispensable to students. The introduction to each section of the book is followed by an exhaustive bibliography; each writer whose work is represented is made the subject of a brief biography, and the entire volume is rendered doubly valuable by the index, which is worked out in great detail.

THE SEVEN PURSUES. By Margaret Cameron. Harper & Bros., \$1.

This narrative contains a series of remarkable experiences with "automatic writing," into which the writer protests she was drawn much against her will and contrary to all previous habits and prejudices. Her narrative, involving expressions and messages purporting to come from the other world, is extraordinary, to say the least.

"NIX RED MONTHS IN RUSSIA." By Louise Bryant. George H. Doran Co., \$2.

The impressions of the author while living in Russia before and during the proletarian dictatorship. Her observations are of a kind to throw new light upon a situation which has come to be regarded as hopelessly complicated. The portrait she draws of Kerensky reveals some of the interest once so keenly felt in that baffling and dreamy character.

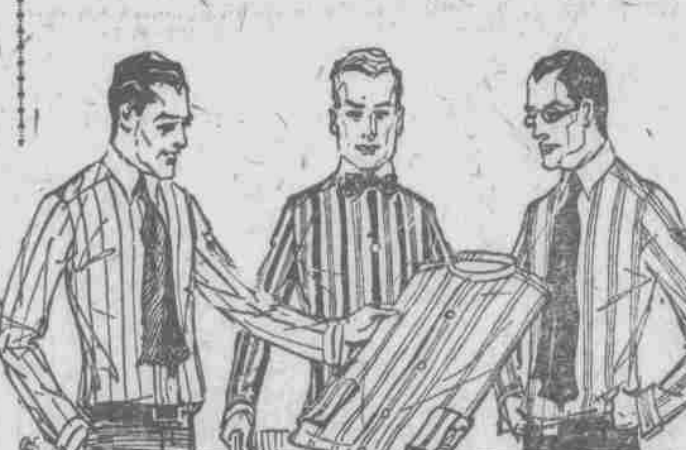
