

OMAHA WOMAN IS SUED FOR \$12,000 BY RICH FARMER

Saunders County Man Brings Court Action Here as Result of Alleged Love Affair.

The old story of the trusting country boy and the dazzling "city girl" is said to be back of a suit filed in district court yesterday by Joseph F. Bauer against La Rance Buckwalter for \$12,000.

Mr. Bauer alleges that Miss Buckwalter persuaded him to pay her sums of money aggregating \$12,000 by "fraud, imposition and deceit."

According to Bauer's story, he met the dazzling Miss Buckwalter and loved her. He told County Attorney Shotwell that he advanced money on many pretexts to the fair one, under the impression that some time they would be married.

Mr. Bauer called on Mr. Shotwell a few days ago and laid his whole romance before him, to see whether he couldn't have his former inamorata prosecuted for getting the money from him.

Mr. Shotwell told him to bring in the checks and other evidence if he had them, and he would see whether the case was such that criminal prosecution could be started.

Instead of doing this Mr. Bauer filed the civil suit.
