

BAVARIAN RED ARMY PLANNED BY NEW REGIME

Council Proclaims "Brotherly Connection" With Russians and Hungarians; Attacks German Republic.

Munich, April 8.—Complete severance from the old German imperialism, still manifest in the Ebert-Scheidemann government, and the resumption of a "brotherly connection" with the Russian and Hungarian peoples, is announced in the proclamation of the new soviet government for Bavaria formed here.

Shops Closed. The Associated Press correspondent touring the city found every Korean shop and place of business closed and shuttered.

Foreigners, as well as Koreans, allege serious maltreatment of those who have taken part in the demonstrations. The Union Severeance hospital, founded by L. H. Severance of Cleveland, has as patients from this cause, 24 Koreans, including a boy of 15.

No Prisoners Tortured. He denied that prisoners were tortured. Tortures were so frequent in Korean history, he explained, the Koreans seemed to believe that they were being continued under the Japanese rule.

GENERAL SMUTS FAILS TO EFFECT NEW ARMISTICE

British Leader Departs From Budapest; American Wives of Hungarians Leave at Same Time, Taking Money.

Budapest, April 8.—While Gen. Jan Christian Smuts, who was sent here by the peace conference at Paris had authority to arrange a new armistice between Hungary and the entente powers, it appears that he did not do so.
