No regular meeting of Bertha Vaughn's group was held during the week, the girls being busy with the drive for funds to establish the summer camp.

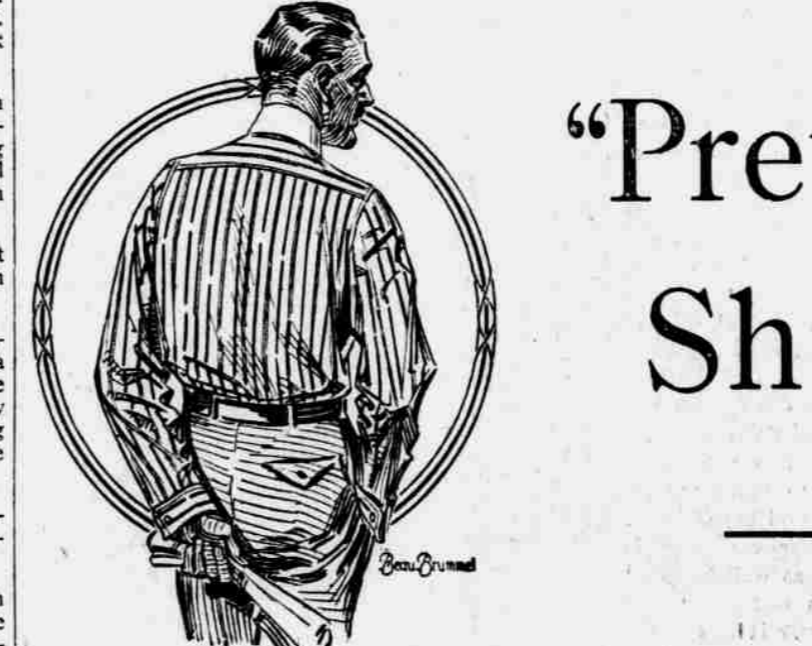
Prizes for Essays.
