

AUTHORIZE NEW GUARD UNITS ON BASIS OF PEACE

War Department Permits Immediate Formation of State Military Regiments in Four States.

Washington, April 23.—Reconstruction of the national guard was actually started today when the War department, through the bureau of military affairs, authorized the organization of seven regiments and one extra battalion of infantry, one squadron of cavalry and eight companies of coast artillery.

Present Units Illegal.

These new units are intended to replace state troops which, under Section 61 of the national defense act, cannot be legally maintained by the states in time of peace.

Based on Peace Status.

The units authorized today must be in such state of organization before June 30 as to be eligible for federal recognition, if the War department is to extend financial aid.

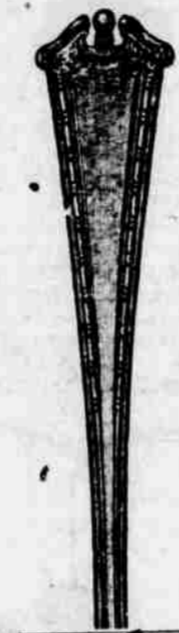

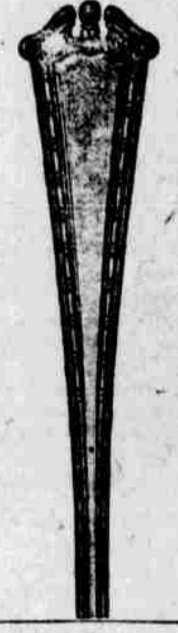
