Judge Patrick in municipal court ruled that a drug store ice cream service does not come within the meaning of the state statute which requires that no racial discrimination shall be shown in certain public places. Fannie Goodlet brought suit for \$1,000 against the Bemis Park pharmacy. Thirty-third and Cuming

streets, for \$1,000, alleging that on August 18, 1918, she and her son were refused ice cream on the specific explanation that "colored people were not servide." In holding against the plaintiff, the

judge declared that the state law mentions restaurants, but that it did not contemplate the circumstances complained of in her petition.
