Wichita was ineffective and the Indians collected eight runs off him in the first two innings.

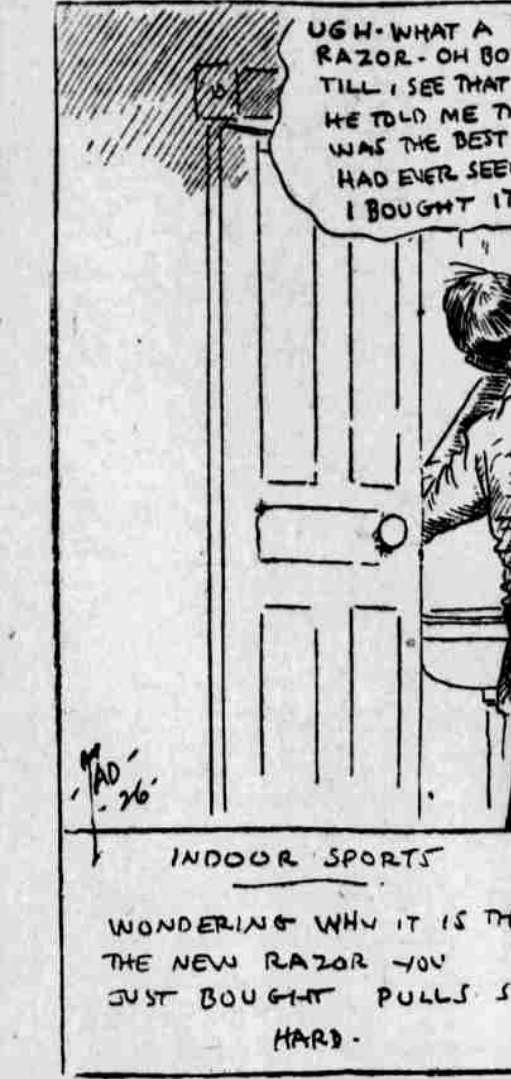
