

### WARNS COUNCIL TO PREPARE FOR CARE OF TURKEY

Stand of President Wilson Starts Two Distinct Movements in Regard to Turkish Problem.

Paris, May 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—President Wilson has informed the council of four, it was reported in peace conference circles today, that the other members of the council would be prepared for the United States not to take a mandate for Constantinople or any other part of Turkey. This is interpreted not as the personal inclination of the president against a mandate, but as a precaution in case congress does not approve of a Turkish mandate.

The reported stand of the president has had the effect of starting two distinct movements with relation to the Turkish problem. The first is to place Constantinople under an international commission in which all the great powers would have a voice. Should this not prove

### Ex-Kaiser's Utterances Prove Guilt Beyond Doubt

International Tribunal Merely Needs to Quote Former Ruler's Own Speeches to Prove High Crime Against Universal Morality—Eleven Points Historically Grouped, Cited.

(By Universal Service.) Paris, May 24.—When former Emperor William II. of Germany is placed on trial before an international tribunal for having committed high crimes against universal morality he will furnish the incriminating evidence against himself. In fact, the commission which had his case in hand and reported to the peace conference is held to have prepared enough evidence to convict the former kaiser by merely quoting the speeches he made before and during the war.

Here is the list of 11 points, historically grouped:

1. In May, 1905, the kaiser said to Zorn von Bulach, then secretary of state for Alsace Lorraine: "If they drive me to the utmost I shall invade France. Let England turn against us and destroy Hamburg, I shall settle things at Paris."
2. On October 26, 1915, the kaiser speaking at the unveiling of a statue erected in honor of Field Marshal Count von Moltke, said: "You see, gentlemen, the position we occupy in the world. Therefore, keep the powder dry, the sword sharpened, the eyes aimed at the object, the muscles strained—and down with the pessimists."
3. June 13, 1918, speaking at Doberitz, after reviewing his troops,

he said: "Let them all come up, we are ready for them."

4. August 25, 1918, speaking at Koenigsberg he said: "I consider myself an instrument of God without paying the slightest attention to the talk of the day, I follow my own road."

**Take Paris or Die.**

5. In an order of the day, issued to the troops and dated August 30, 1918, he said: "You must take Paris or die."

6. In an address to the troops on the Yser, September 23, 1914, he said: "I am the instrument of the All Highest. I am His sword and His representative. Death to all those who would oppose my will. Death to all those who would not believe in my mission. Let perish all the enemies of the German people."

**Spare No Towns.**

7. In 1915, when German armies invaded Russia, he addressed them as follows: "Should you be forced to retire in Poland, then spare no town and no house. The earth beneath your feet shall be bare."

8. October 12, 1915, addressing socialist members of the Reichstag, he said: "France is the greatest disappointment of my life. I have decided that it must perish."

**No Nonsense From U. S.**

9. October, 1916, he said to Ambassador Gerard: "After this war I shall stand no more of this nonsense coming from the United States."

10. In June, 1917, he telegraphed to King Constantine of Greece: "Your detestment of course, will be only temporary. 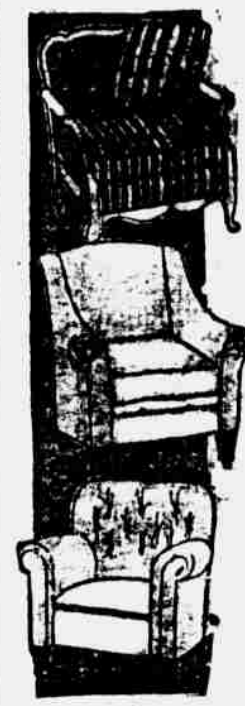

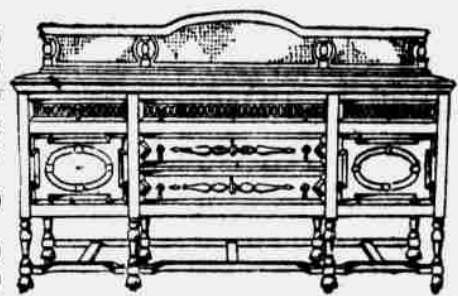

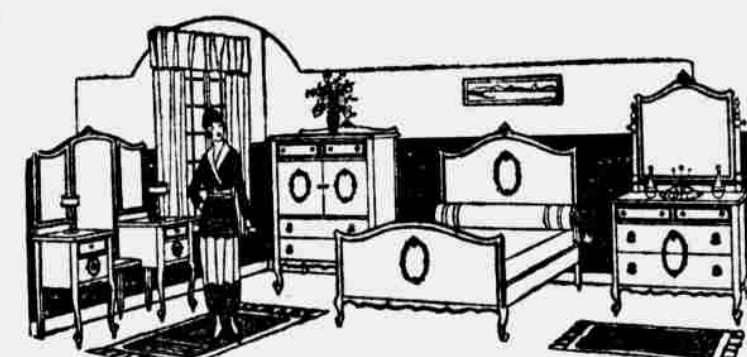
