Based on pre-war prices. Total national debt, funded and unfunded, was \$441,020,800 December 31, 1918. All of the funded debt has been issued for revenue-producing properties, such as state- owned railroads, telegraphs, telephones, hydro-electric plants, canals, loans to aid agriculture, and loans to privately-owned railroads. Per capita debt at end of 1918 was \$76.59, compared with \$210 for the United States.

Actual expenditures for 1917 and 1918 have not been recorded, but the revenues exceeded budget estimates by \$50,039,000 in 1917, and by \$20,257,- 000 in 1918. Revenues are derived from taxation and state properties. State properties earned an average surplus of between \$15,000,000 and \$20,000,000 annually up to 1918, but showed a deficit of \$1,570,000 for 1918, owing to in-
