

NEWSPAPER OF A. E. F. SUSPENDS PUBLICATION

Stars and Stripes, Creation of Enlisted Men in Army, Reached Circulation of 500,000.

Paris, June 13.—The Stars and Stripes, official newspaper of the American expeditionary forces, suspended publication with today's issue, after a successful career beginning with a 30,000 edition February 8, and reaching a high-water mark circulation of 526,000 in February last.

The original project was fostered by Second Lt. (now major) Guy T. Viskinski, formerly of the Wheeler Syndicate of New York, and lately in charge of publicity for the Liberty loan campaign in New York. Maj. Mark S. Watson, formerly of the Chicago Tribune, is now the officer in charge, assisted by First Lt. Stephen T. Early, formerly of the Associated Press. First Lt. Milton S. Ayers is the present business manager.

Has Followed Flag.

The paper has followed the flag into all parts of the world, has correspondents and field agents with all parts of the American expeditionary forces, and headquarters in the heart of the opera quarter, Paris.

It counts among its accomplishments the raising of a fund of 2,000,000 francs from the members of the American expeditionary forces for 3,567 war orphans of France.

Staff Is Cited.

With the return of over half of the American expeditionary force its circulation has maintained steady ratio, losing about one copy for every four men returned. The paper was recently visited by Secretary Baker and General Pershing, who gave citations to several of the enlisted personnel.

The paper has been persistently the creation of enlisted men of the American expeditionary force, the editorial board itself deciding questions of policy and being composed of men from the ranks. Sergt. Philip A. Von Blon is the present managing editor, having succeeded to the position formerly held by Pvt. Harold W. Ross and Pvt. John T. Winterich, who are now sailing home, carrying with them citations from the commander-in-chief of the American expeditionary forces. Of the original force, two remain; these are, Sergt. Hudson Hawley, who wrote most of the first three numbers and Pvt. Abjan Wallgren, whose cartoons have been one of the principal features of the paper.
