## Reproduce Flanders Field in Boston for Soldiers' Memorial

Boston, June 28.—There will be a "Memory Garden" this year at Franklin Park.

Flanders Field poppies will be planted in June and through the summer months they will gleam red among the other flowers in the herbaceous garden—a reminder of American blood that is mingled forever with the soil of France. It is a shade smaller than the orient poppies, which are the variety with which we are most familiar in this country.

"It will go into the ground in June out at Franklin Park," said Park Commissioner James B. Shea, "and while it will probably never grow naturally in America, there is no reason that planted from year to year the Flanders poppy cannot always be blooming in the summer season 'over here' as well as 'over there.'"

**City Has Oil Well.**  
Pasadena, Cal. June 28.—Oil found on 54 acres of land owned by the city of Pasadena may go a long way in helping taxpayers bear the burden of the cost of city government. One has already been drilled and is turning out 300 barrels a day. The land is in the Narrows of the Rio Hondo, below El Monte. The Pan-American Petroleum company has a royalty lease on the land, the city receiving one-sixth of the flow. Other wells will be sunk.

**No Wine for New Boat.**  
Boothbay Harbor, Me., June 28.—Christened with spring water, the four-masted schooner Bradford M. Jones, the largest vessel ever built in Lincoln county, was launched here. The sponsor was Miss Katherine P. Jones, of Brockton, Mass., daughter of the man for whom the schooner is named.

## Had Sleeping Sickness Five Months Before Death

Calumet, Okla., June 28.—The first victim of sleeping sickness in this locality is Mrs. Robert Crowley, who died here after five months of sickness. Taken ill in December, she has been asleep most of the time since December 16 until her death just before Memorial day. The woman had an attack of influenza early in December, and the sleeping sickness followed.

**Chick's Heart Beats Seen.**  
Springfield, Ill., June 28.—Roy Stover has a chicken on exhibition here, the keel bone of which is mis-

ing. Instead it has a heart shape opening about one-half inch in diameter covered by a film of tissue so thin the heart can be seen beating underneath. The chicken is just passing through the "pin feather" stage.

**To Work for France, 85.**  
Los Angeles, Cal., June 28.—Mrs. Rebecca Newbold Wylie is 85 years old. She wants to devote the rest of her life working for France. She has made application here for a passport to France. The aged woman will be accompanied by her daughter, Miss Jeanne d'Estimaville, 55. Both mother and daughter worked for France during the war.
