

LARGE CROWD AT CHURCH SERVICE IN KOUNTZE PARK

Absence of Many People Showed in Small Congregations at Meetings; Few Evening Services.

Omaha churches all entered fully upon their summer schedules of curtailed services yesterday to continue until September 1. There were practically no evening services in individual churches. In several parts of the city union services in the parks brought large crowds.

Even in the morning services the absence of many people from the city on vacations or attending religious conferences showed in small congregations.

The union services of five congregations in the Kountze park district which started last Sunday evening were very well attended. Several hundred chairs and benches were provided and all were filled.

Rev. Dr. J. R. Work preached in the morning at the First United Presbyterian church, Twenty-first and Emmett streets.

At Parkvale Presbyterian church Rev. Earl B. Clark who was an army chaplain in France, preached both morning and evening.

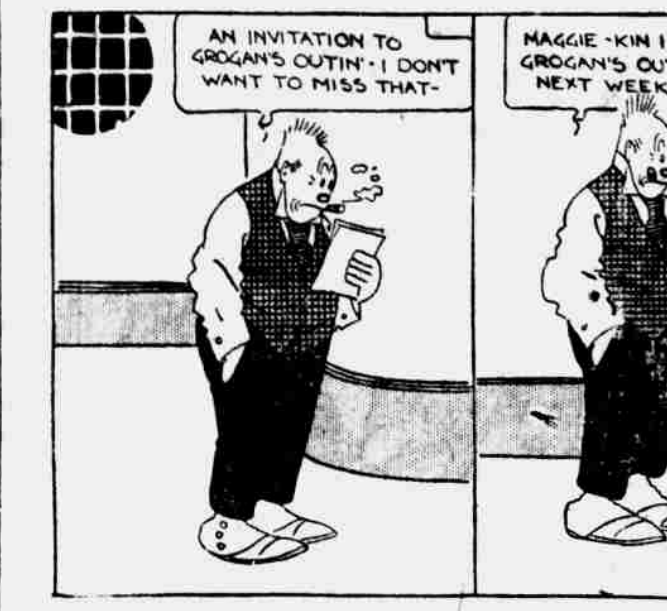

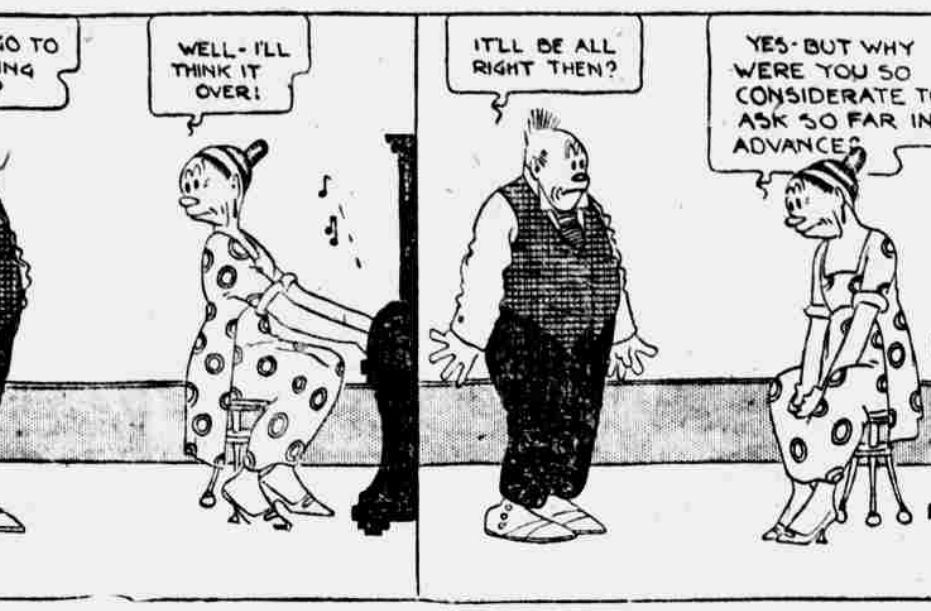
