RAILROAD HEAD REPORTS CROPS IN WEST LARGE

Finds Nebraska Garden Spot of Entire Grain Belt— Eastern Farmers Are Moving West.

"On the trip that I am now completing I have traveled the country from Washington to the Pacific coast and there is no portion over which I have been that with an agricultural or business viewpoint looks better," said J. L. Edwards, manager of the agricultural section, traffic division of the United States railroad administration.

Nearly a month ago Mr. Edwards started on a tour of the west and central west, to get in close touch with agricultural conditions and obtain information relative to the resource and crop prospects of the grain belt.

In Omaha he visited the land departments of the Burlington and Union Pacific, made a trip to the Union stockyards, and addressed the trade extension committee of the Omaha Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Allen is just in from traveling across the state from end to end, and I have no hesitancy in saying that Nebraska has the appearance of a vast garden. Everywhere in the state I hear reports of good yields of small grain, and as to corn, I never saw it look better.
