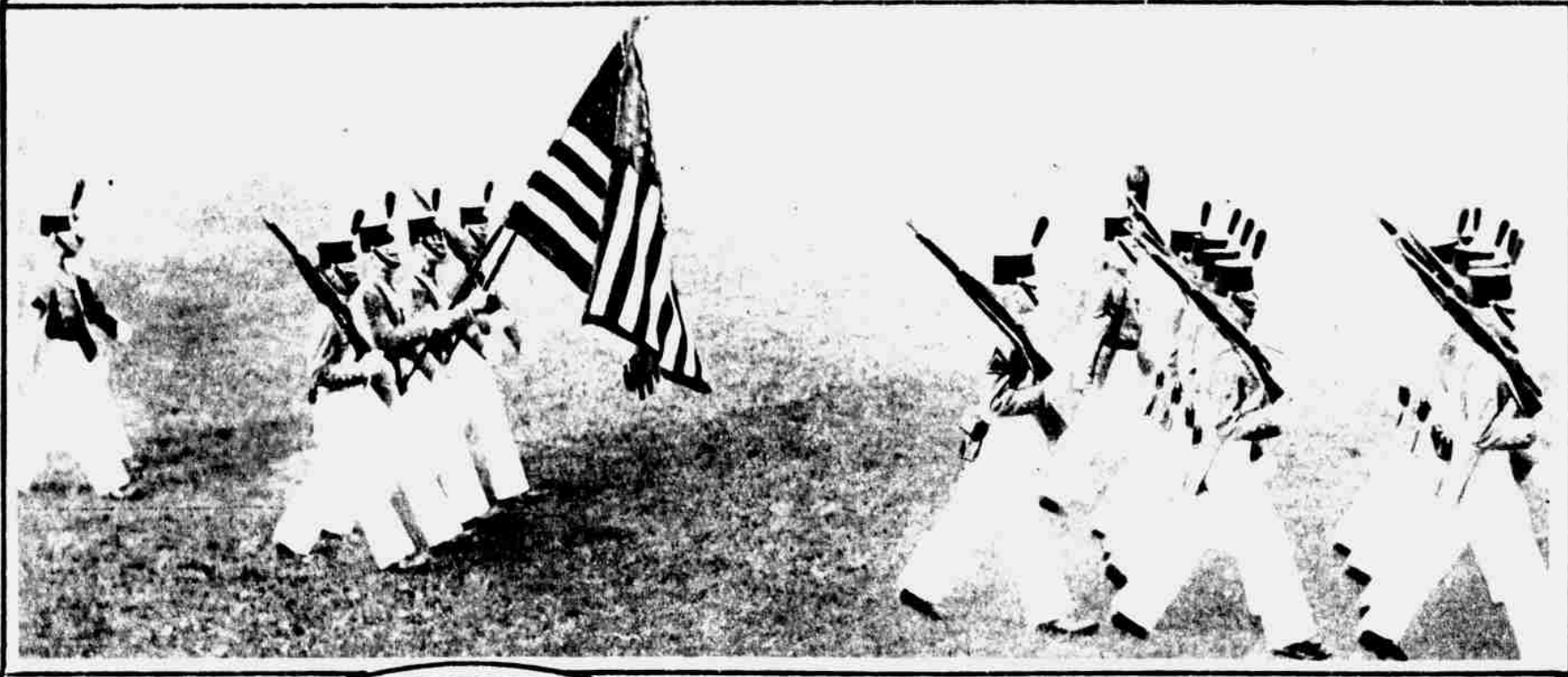


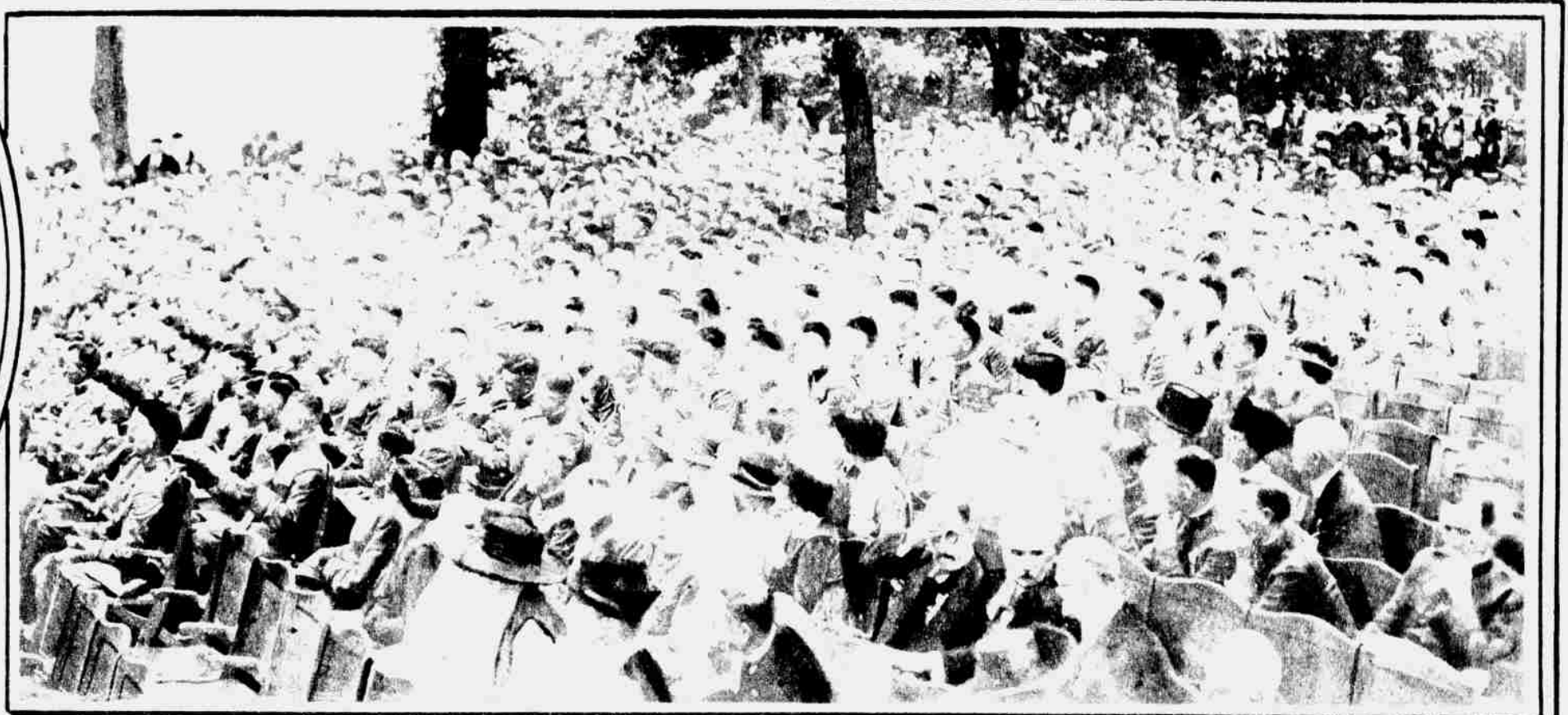

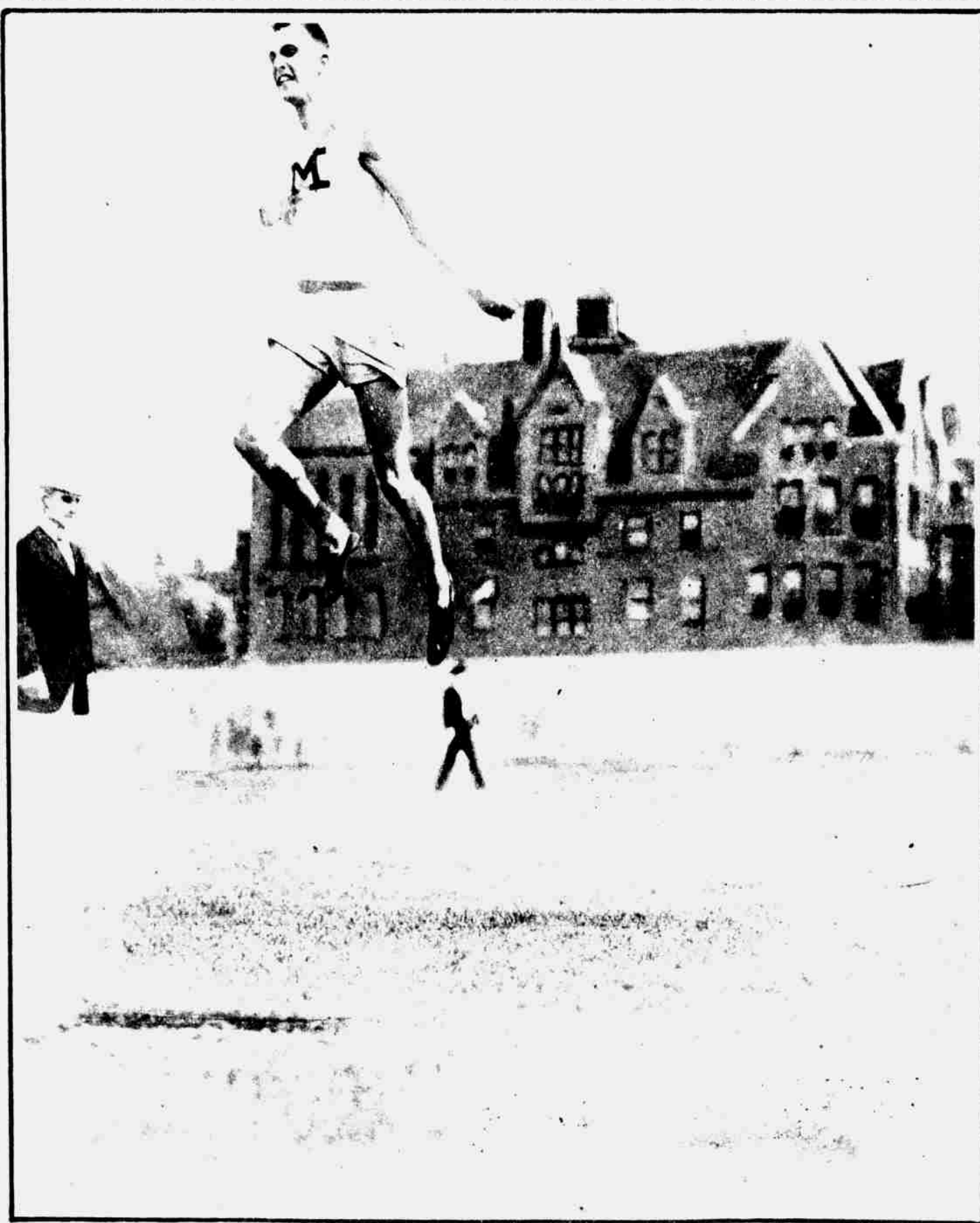


Lt. George Horowitz of Passaic, N. J., the high honor man of the 1917 class at West Point. He was commander of the Students' Officers Corps.
