

### CIRCUS REACHES OMAHA FOR TWO PERFORMANCES

Big Parade of Open Cages, Elephants, Camels and Shetland Ponies at 10 O'Clock.

"The World's First Super-Circus" came to town today and while most older folks are at the breakfast table, hundreds of working men—with the undivided moral support of twice as many youngsters—are placing the great tents of the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey combined shows in preparation for the performances that are to be given here this afternoon and night.

The mammoth circus came here on its many trains from Sioux City. Those who followed the early morning cavalcades from the railroad tracks to the show grounds witnessed the erection of the scores of tents.

This morning's street parade is scheduled to reach the business district shortly after 10 o'clock. Like all else connected with the big circus, it promises to be of greater length and brilliancy than any of its predecessors. There will be many novelties, coupled with the more usual sights, such as block after block of open cages, tableaux floats, gorgeous chariots and people of many strange lands. The elephant division surpasses anything of the kind ever attempted. The horses represent the pick of the world's most beautiful circus equines. There will be camel teams in gorgeous trappings, many bands of music, three calliopes and a whole brigade of clowns.

Among the scores of wonderful tableaux cars will be 20 representing as many different countries, and there will be a gorgeously carved barge of state for every continent.

Today's circus performances will begin at 2 and 8 p. m., but the doors to the menagerie and connecting main tent will open an hour earlier. A brilliant pageant will follow the promenade concert. This gorgeous spectacle will introduce hundreds of characters in costume, whole regiments of horses, and depict in panoramic splendor many of the picture book heroines so dear to the hearts of the young.

The famous girl performers, who are both veritable "leading ladies" of the circus are Mlle. Leitzel, greatest of all aerial gymnasts and Miss Bird Millman, the dainty little "Queen of the Wire." Both are the greatest performers in the world in their particular line, and both will be seen on the same program here with the great circus combination. Australian axmen felling great trees in contests will be another remarkable feature. In all, almost three hours of ardent surprises will be presented in the great circus "big top," which is the largest tent ever constructed. All the aerialists, riders, acrobats and clowns of the world will be seen on one program for the first time, and there will be an unprecedented number of animal features, including five great elephant troupes, comprising what is known as a "quarter of a million pound elephant act." Five troupes of trained seals, wonderful dog and pony acts, and scores of funniest clowns on earth will be on hand to amuse the children.

### Wedded 11 Days After Divorce, Wants Second Marriage Annulled

Eleven days after her first husband secured a divorce from her in the Douglas county district court, Theresa Groth married Arthur Bomar in Council Bluffs, she says, in a petition filed in district court yesterday to have the latest marriage annulled. Marriage in less than six months after divorce is illegal.

Henry Groth secured a divorce from her on August 14, 1919. He alleged that she preferred the company of other men to his own.

Theresa says that Arthur told her she was free to get married, though the statutory six months had not elapsed since her divorce. But the day after the marriage she learned, she says, that she had acted illegally.

Mrs. Garvey was born in Montreal, Canada, in 1847, and came to Omaha in 1857. She had been married 50 years when her husband died four years ago.

Surviving are three daughters, Helen, Anna and Catherine, and two sons, Leo and Charles M. Funeral services will be held Saturday morning at 9 from St. Cecilia's church. Burial will be in the Holy Sepulcher cemetery.

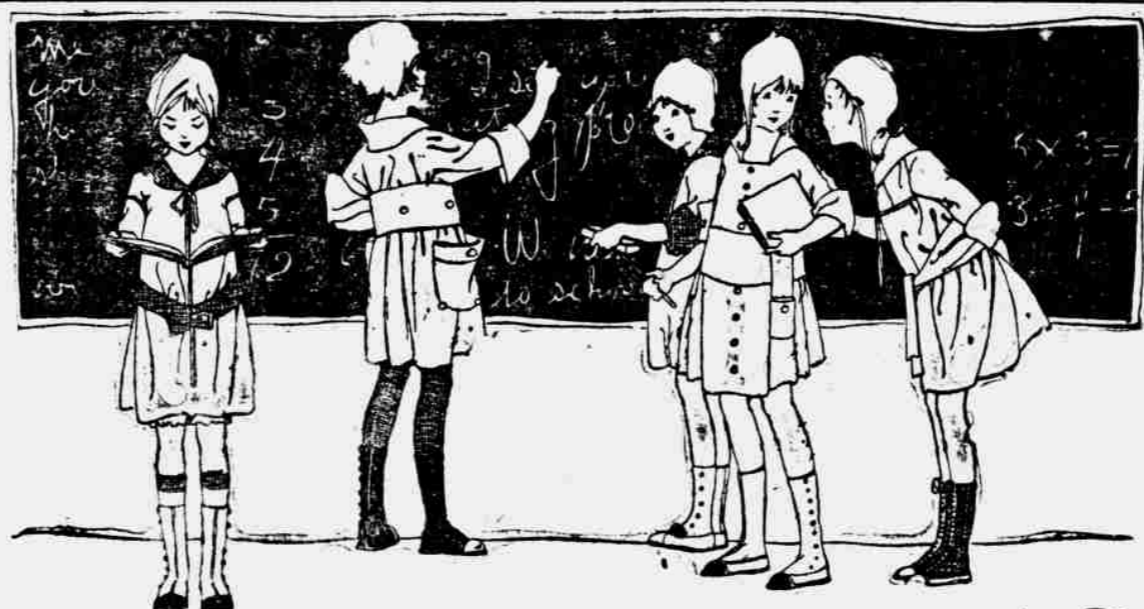
