ASKS PERMANENT U. S. TRANSPORT

Fleet Capable of Transporting 142,000 Troops Is Proposed by War Department In Reorganization.

Washington, Aug. 30 .- Organization of a permanent "transport reserve" capable of carrying 142,000 troops, is proposed by the War dedepartment as a part of the army reorganization plan. This reserve with the regular army transport fleet would make it possible to move an expeditionary force of nearly 200,000 men immediately on the outbreak of war.


The plan as outlined by Brig Gen. Frank T. Hines, in charge of the army transport service, contemplates reserving title to 15 of the former German passenger ships and a number of cargo carriers, with their allocation to commercial lines on the conditions that the crews be enlisted in the transport reserve and that no structural changes in the vessels be made by the operators. All of the ships are now in perfect shape for army use and General Hines would have them subject to periodical inspection by army engineers.


