Lincoln, Sept. 3.—(Special.)—The sensation of the fair so far has been the flying of Lieutenant Locklear, who appears to defy all elements of the air and performs stunts that keep the people with their hearts in their throats most of the time.

DENIES DEMAND OF NONPARTISAN LEAGUE HEADS

Governor Will Not Oust Be-atrice Officials Until Action Has Been Taken in Courts.

Lincoln, Sept. 3.—(Special.)—A delegation representing the Non-partisan league, to the number of about 75, called upon Governor McKelvie Wednesday in an effort to bring before him the facts regarding the disturbances of a Non-partisan league meeting at Beatrice some time ago.

The delegation was headed by Jesse R. Johnson of Lincoln, manager for the organization in Nebraska; C. A. Sorenson, league attorney; J. D. Ream of Broken Bow, Milton Young of Beatrice and Mr. Deitz of the same place, who did most of the talking.

Will Not Act.

The governor told the delegation that it was his purpose to give protection to all meetings conducted along right lines, but that the statutes provided that where an assault had been made, as in the case at Beatrice, the courts were to be called upon, and until that recourse had been taken he would not act.
