Chicago, Sept. 16.—New upward swings in the value of corn took place today largely as a result of symptoms that distressed liquidation was over for the present. Closing prices were strong, 2%c to 31.40% and December \$1.40% to \$1.40% and December \$1.22% to \$1.23. Oats gained 1 to 1½c. In provisions the outcome ranged from 12c decline to a rise of 55c.

Notwithstanding demoralization of foreign exchange and despite weakness in the he hop market, corn prices at the opening slanted toward a higher level and with only brief interruptions continued to increase in strength. Shorts covered freely on the advance and there was persistent buying from other sources, including eash interests and the general public. Domestic shipping business was said to have been the most active in months. Bulls therefore met less difficulty obtaining acceptance of statements that European financial conditions had been more than discounted in the corn market. Optimism regarding labor unrest was also made much of as a basis for buying.

Oats ascended with corn. Houses with eastern connections were conspicuous on the bull side.
