Mayor Smith Praises City 'Heroic' Policemen for Their Failure to Do Their Duty

From Sick Bed, City's Chief Executive Issues Remarkable Signed Statement, Which Embarrasses Friends and Supporters—Question as to Whether He Has Yet Recovered from Effects of Beating by the Mob.

A statement issued by Mayor Smith yesterday from the hospital, lauding the courage and bravery of the Omaha policemen on the scene of the riot last week, and declaring no braver men ever wore policemen's uniforms, is proving a source of embarrassment and anxiety to close friends and advisers of the mayor.

The statement is taken as indicative of the state of mind of the city's chief executive, which is feared may have been caused by the severe beating he suffered at the hands of the brutal mob.
