Stuffed Cabbage.

Take a large, fresh cabbage, cut out heart, fill vacancy with stuffingmade of the left-over fish (chicken or veal), chopped very fine and highly seasoned, and rolled into balls with yolk of egg. Then tie cabbage firmly together (some tie a cloth around it), boil in a covered kettle two hours. This is a delicious dish and useful in using up cold meats or fish.

Haricot Bean Salad.

Soak the haricots six or eight with sliged tomato or beet root and some shredded clery. Cover with whipped cream, flavored with salt and pepper (white). If liked dip the haricot in oil and vinegar in addition to cream.
