

TAX STATEMENTS OF MANY CLASSES WILL BE DELAYED

Complete Statements On Curbing and Paving Assessments Cannot Be Made Before Jan. 1, 1920.

Statements for many classes of taxes, both city and county, cannot be furnished for several weeks or months, Treasurer Endres announced yesterday, because of the destruction of many records in the court house fire. Complete statements on curbing and paving assessments cannot be made before January 1, 1920, but payments can be made now, subject to correction.

Statements of assessments for sewer, sidewalk, grading, boulevard and miscellaneous assessments can be furnished and receipts issued November 15, 1919.

Statements of 1918 county taxes cannot be furnished before March 1, 1920, but payments can be made and receipts issued if the person is satisfied that the 1918 county taxes are unpaid. Records for all years prior to 1918 are intact. Payments can be made and statements furnished for any and all city real estate taxes now due.

Statements cannot be furnished for redemption from tax sales before November 10, 1919.

Statements for county personal taxes (except 1919) cannot be furnished before May 1, 1920. Statements can be furnished and receipts issued for city personal taxes for the years 1890 to 1919, inclusive.

Statements and receipts can be now issued for all real and personal taxes, also assessments on property located in original city of South Omaha, at the South Side sub-treasury; county taxes, both real and personal, are due and payable November 1, 1919. Personal becomes delinquent December 1, 1919; real estate delinquent May 1, 1920.
