London, Nov. 28.—Debate on the coal situation is scheduled in the House of Commons today, following the introduction of a motion by William Bruce, a labor member, calling for the appointment of a committee to inquire into the cost of production, the output and prices of coal.

The government treat the issue as a matter of confidence and has issued urgent instructions to its supporters informing them the adoption of the motion would be equivalent to a vote of censure. It is assumed the government will resign if the motion is successful.

Argentina and Chile to Back Road Over Andes Buenos Aires, Nov. 28.—An agreement by which the governments of Argentina and Chile would jointly loan the Transandine railroads of the two countries 1,000,000 pounds sterling for the improvement of their transcontinental line was perfected in conferences here at which were present representatives of the two governments and the rail systems.

Australian Peace Loan Melbourne, Nov. 28.—The new peace loan now open to subscription is approximately \$125,000,000, will run for eight years, and will pay 5 per cent interest with a special bonus. Most of the proceeds will be devoted to reparation work.
