## Providence Mayor Picks Worthy Girls

Who Are "Common People?" What Constitutes Worthiness?

New York, Dec. 6.—Count Paul Bajnotti of Turin, Italy, little knew what he was starting when he so generously made a bequest of \$10,000, the interest of which is to be awarded annually to the "most worthy" girl in Providence, R. I. This is no criticism of the nobility of motive that prompted this act, nor an implication that rewarding virtue is superfluous. Not at all!

But the count used one phrase that we fear may not add to his popularity. He said that the fair and worthy one must be of the "common people." Now who would wish to be dubbed "common"? Having just finished off a war to make the nation safe for democracy, are real Americans willing to be of the "common people," even if a chaplet of roses is thrown in for good measure according to directions set forth along with the emolument? It will be interesting to see what developments arise from this unusual bequest of Count Bajnotti. Mayor Joseph H. Gainer of Providence is to be the god in the machine, and he doesn't like the job a bit, either. He said so in no unambiguous terms. He announced his intention of appointing a commission of young unmarried men to choose the yearly paragon.

The requirement for the honor? The interest of the \$10,000 bequest will go to "a daughter of the people who by her conduct and family virtue is most deserving." And she will be crowned with roses.

The wisdom of establishing the annual prize for feminine excellence has been challenged in some quarters. Again the question of deciding what constitutes worthiness has been widely discussed. But most of all has criticism been brought against the wording, "common people."

An interesting viewpoint is that of Judge Franklin C. Hoyt of the children's court, who has had ample opportunity of observing human nature.

"Opinions differ as to what makes up worthiness."

"The best boy or girl in school—that is, the best pupil," said the justice, "may not add often is not the best in relation to his or her fellows. I should say the most worthy girl was the one that showed

the best example to others of her own age.

"If this offer is going to be taken seriously by the people of Providence, it should be open to all classes, rich and poor."

"I should say we were all the common people. My belief is no class distinctions."

Some versions of the award are to the effect that the young lady to be chosen must be the most "marriageable." This side of the situation we discussed with Mrs. Olive Scott Gabriel, noted woman lawyer and social worker.

"The most marriageable woman is the one that would make the best companion, the most congenial mental type. Of course, I realize that any one woman chosen in this way would not necessarily be the ideal companion for just anybody," said Mrs. Gabriel, thereby showing that one man's companion may be another's cup of poison.

"The most worthy young woman is to my mind the most generally helpful," she continued. "Character generally develops under opposition, with women just as with men, and character cannot be tested till it is severely tried out."

"For judges of the girl to be chosen I would have married people and perhaps a few single ones."

"Then let them choose a girl with a receptive mind, a fair amount of

ambition, one who shows herself to be actuated by high motives in her dealings with others."

Another authoritative opinion was given by Lieut. Col. Ernest K. Coulter, lately returned from Europe and established as general manager of the Children's Aid society.

"When the will speaks of 'common people' we must remember we are all common people," he said. "Our Declaration of Independence and our constitution both make this plain. The basis of selection might be the helpfulness of the young woman to the community."

"It should not be a matter of physical beauty or amiability, but rather the selection of a young woman who, decided by common agreement,
