City Planning Commission Mapped Out Many Traffic Improvements for Omaha In the Last Year.

The most important work taken tp during the year by the city planning commission was the zoning lan which has been embodied in the form of an ordinance, which will le presented to the city council soon for enactment into law, according to the authority granted by the

state legislature.
Ten cities of the United States already have adopted zoning plans and 30 other cities are taking the

Preliminary steps.

Preliminary study maps showing the use of land, height of buildings. sercentage of area occupied buildings, topography of the land. amount of occupied and unoccupied land, location of industry, location of apartments and tenements, transit lines and their relation to population; and charts showing direction of winds and percentages of city area occupied by public property, railroads, industry, commerce and residence, were completed in preparation for the actual zoning of the

Work on the final maps, dividing the city into various zones, regulating the use of land, area of land to be occupied and height of building. is now well under way. A new map of Omaha was completed to be used in the zoning work. A great amount of statistical work and tabulation was included in the preliminary work necessary for zoning.

Plans for Extensions.

During the year the City Planning commission worked out plans and detail studies of a number of extensions, widenings and improve-ments of streets and boulevards. Among those now under process of appraisement are the Harney street widening from Twentieth to Twenty-sixth streets. Twentieth street widening from Leavenworth to Dodge; Twenty-second street opening from Howard to Dodge; Twenty-fourth street widening from Pacific to Cuming; Douglas street widening and opening from Twen-tieth to Twenty-seventh street; and the Center street widening from Thirty-fourth west to the city lim-

One of the most important improvements for the city is the proposed river front boulevard, now being mapped and surveyed. The route leads from the Fontenelle forest reserve on the south to Ponca creek, north of Florence. The Inner Belt Traffic way is in

process of mapping. It consists of a broad, paved traffic street, following the route of the Omaha Belt line, from Sixteenth and Sprague Sixteenth and Leavenworth streets. It will give easy truck transportation for industries located

Work is now under way for the widening and extension of St Marys avenue, from Nineteenth street to Turner boulevard, making it the main traffic street to the southwest part of the city. The widening and opening of Thirtieth street is another project now being mapped. Drawings for the connection of Commercial and Redman avenues

have been completed.

Design New Buildings. Several buildings have been designed for the city. Among them are the Jefferson square bath house, designed and built under the supervision of this department; the Carter lake bath house and the shelter house and keeper's house at Riverview park, for which plans, details and specifications were prepared, and the comfort station at Sixteenth and Dodge streets.

Four new playgrounds have been proposed by this department at corty-seventh and Grant streets, Thirty-third and Lake streets, Twenty-seventh and Erskine streets, and Twenty-first and Charles streets. A map showing the school population of the city and its relation to the present and proposed playds and parks is now being pre-

Studies for interior developments of Elmwood and Carter Lake parks have been completed, and the plans contemplated, and the work is now under way for the new athletic park at Twentieth and L streets. Studies for the development of the river front have also been made

A complete report in book form. explaining the various projects for street improvements, widenings, extensions, etc., has been prepared and issued by this department.

Street Maintenance Report Shows Extent Of Work Done by City

The street cleaning and maintenance department, in charge of City Commissioner D. B. Butler, has the care of 256 miles of paved streets and 675 miles of unpaved streets in

Greater Omaha.

A summary of the year's work to December 23 follows:

45,960 square yards of asphalt laid in the repairing of paved streets.
1,376 lineal feet of culverts con-

atructed.
2,118 blocks of dirt streets re-

paired.
4.114 blocks of dirt streets repaired and rounded up.

21,156 blocks of paved streets dry cleaned by wagons, trucks and

laborers. 15,814 blocks of sweepings hauled off paved streets. 21,096 blocks of paved streets

6.192 blocks of weeds cut. 85,890 loads of snow hauled. 6,215 loads of cinders hauled for the repair of unpaved streets.


