





Agreement to these changes, however, was under-

stood to be conditional on certain concessions by democrats in regard to other reservations The counter proposal was drafted

by mild reservation republicans and submitted to Senator Lodge before being laid before the democrats. Senators of this group said after ward that Mr. Lodge showed willingness to have the negotiations proceed

As a result both the mild group and the democrats declared progress had been made and were hopeful that at least the controversy might soon be stripped of most of its minor features and narrowed to two






