#### Penchant for Inscribing Marginal Notes Dates Back To 1887.

Suttgart, Jan. 18 .- Former Em William's penchant for in scribing marginal notes on documents passing through his hands still Prince Wilhelm. This practice apparently nettled Bismarck, who requested the heir to the throne to dispense with such effusions, which

the prince promised to do.

This is one of the incidents brought out in the third volume of "Iron Chancellor's" memoirs which were the subject of injunc tion proceedings before the court ench announced that decision on the former emperor's petition for suppression of the volume would be made known January 24.

Total of Six Letters. The volume contains a total of six letters written by the forme emperor at various stages of his career. One of the first three, written while he was prince, refers to a proclamation he proposed to address to the rulers of confederated states in view of the "not improb-

able eventuality of the early deaths of my grandfather and father. In reply Bismarck told the prince that the best thing he could do was

to consign the proclamation to the fire as quickly as possible. One letter from Emperor Fred erick III, in which he expressed regret over the crown prince's education and general nature, is in cluded in the volume, it is said, for the purpose of proving that the father was out of patience with his son's mental development and general temperament.



Smith answered him that all that is necessary is to file a declaration of candidacy before midnight February 27.



There are two ways of increasing business-taking some of it away from the other fellow, and going out after new business that neither of you have got.

This last is out in the country. There's only a certain total amount in the city, and if you do only a city business you're taking it away from your next door neighbor, and that doesn't do you as much good as it does the other fellow and the city harm.


