
Food Dratts...

Food Drafts will be issued by the First National Bank under arrangements with the American Relief Administration. Herbert Hoover, Chairman.

Food Drafts are issued for \$10.00 and for \$50.00. They insure delivery of food in Hamburg, Warsaw, Vienna, Prague and Budapest.

The exact quantity of food called for by the draft appears on the face, although the right is reserved, in case of an emergency, to substitute commodities of equal food value. Drafts are honored upon presentation within 90 days from date of issue and may be either to the order of an individual or marked "For General Relief."

Buyers of Food Drafts pay the factory cost of food, plus a reasonable margin to cover cost of transportation and insurance. Profits, if any accrue, will be turned over to the European Children's Fund.


