Dallas Alcorn, the accused woman's husband, is 65 years old. They have four children, ranging in age from two weeks to 5 years. Clarence Bell, the nephew, was placed in the Alocra home when his mother died in the county hospitatl at Omaha several weeks ago. His father is in Leavenworth peni-

tentiary.

If the little boy dies from his injuries, a murder charge will be placed against Mrs. Alcorn. A charge of assault and battery has been placed against her and Judge Capell states that an effort will be made to place her own children in an institution.


