Delegates to the state constitu-tional convention have been urged by the Nebraska Civil Reform as-

ludge Lincoln Frost of Lincoln is the president of the Civil Reform association, Mrs. Frederick H. Cole of Omaha secretary, and Raymond Young of Omaha, treasurer. The object of the association is

to establish a system of appointment, promotion and removal in the civil service upon the principle that admission to public office should depend upon proven fitness. It will demand that appointments to nearly all subordinate executive offices be made from persons whose fitness has been ascertained by competitive examinations open to all applicants properly qualified.
It will insist that removals shall be made for legitimate cause only, such as dishonesty, negligence or inefficiency, but not for political opinion or refusal to render party

service. The association will advocate all other appropriate measures for securing integrity, intelligence, efficiency, good order and discipline in the civil service. It is understood that the work of the association nonpartisan and nonsec will be


