## "INTERCHURCH" PLAN ENDORSED BY METHODISTS

Great Convention of State Ministers Ends With Important Decision of Powerful Sect.

Lincoln, Neb., Feb. 20.—(Special)—The state-wide conference of Nebraska preachers of all evangelical denominations who for the last three days have been discussing the Interchurch World Movement in Lincoln, ended today in denominational meetings in which the ministers gathered together and discussed the movement as applicable to the communities served by them.

More than 800 Nebraska preachers registered at the conference which was the largest gathering of ministers ever held in this state.

The largest denominational meeting of the day was that of the Methodists. It was attended by more than 250 Nebraska Methodist ministers, and was addressed by Rev. Titus Lowe of Omaha, Rev. W. E. Gratz of Lincoln and other ministers of that denomination. District Superintendent Dr. J. F. Boyce acted as chairman.

In the findings of the committee on resolutions of the Methodists, which was adopted almost unanimously, the Nebraska Methodists endorsed the interchurch world movement in every way, but decided not to participate in the financial program until after the meeting of the general conference in May.

Rev. W. H. Kearns of Omaha presided over the Presbyterian section meeting and Rev. Edwin Hart Jenks of Omaha was the principal speaker.

It was pointed out that since the Presbyterian church is already a body and a soul in the interchurch world movement no resolutions were needed. The Presbyterians took their time in discussing the movement in general and the ways in which the Presbyterian church in Nebraska could best forward the work.

The Interchurch World Movement team from New York, headed by Dr. J. Campbell White, left for Des Moines tonight, where a state-wide meeting for Iowa preachers will be held next week.

## INDUSTRIAL COURT PLAN SUBMITTED TO CONVENTION

Proposal Also Would Provide Method for Protection of Public Service.

Lincoln, Neb., Feb. 20.—A proposal for a constitutional provision, giving the legislature power to create an industrial court to pass upon controversies between employers and employees "in which the public welfare is affected," was presented Friday to the state convention, drafting a new constitution for Nebraska.

The proposal, submitted by the convention's committee on industrial conditions, would also provide that "the interest of the public may be protected by law against interruption either in the public service, or in the production and distribution of commodities essential to the public welfare."

## COLE'S ATTORNEY SCORES PETITION FOR DISBARMENT

Alleges Nothing Unethical in Efforts to Save Client, and Demands Full Inquiry.

Lincoln, Feb. 20.—(Special)—That there has been nothing illegal or unethical in the acts of J. M. Priest, attorney for Anson V. Cole, in his attempts before the courts to save his client from the electric chair, is the statement made by Mr. Priest in letters sent to Attorney General Davis and Chief Justice Meyer of the supreme court.

Mr. Priest asks that the charges against him and other attorneys connected with the case be investigated. The letters are similar in character, but the one to the chief justice goes into the matter more fully, and is as follows:

## Cornell of Cherry Votes For English Language Bill

Lincoln, Feb. 20.—(Special)—An error was made in the placing of the name of Cornell of Cherry in the list of delegates in the constitutional convention as voting to postpone indefinitely proposal No. 326, making the English language the official language of the state. Mr. Cornell voted in favor of the bill, and not for its indefinite postponement.

# LEGISLATION TO CONTROL STATE JOBS IS SOUGHT

Nebraska Civil Reform Association, Recently Organized, Brings Pressure on Delegates to Convention.

W. W. Head, Member of Commission, Tells of Plans Before Lincoln Woman's Club.

Lincoln, Feb. 20.—(Special)—Walter W. Head of Omaha, member of the State Capitol commission, addressed members of the fine arts department of the Lincoln Woman's club Friday afternoon on "State Capitols and Our Own Capitol Building." Mr. Head discussed the "why, how, what, where and when" and said in part:

Pick Three Nebraskans. "In order that our home talent shall not be overlooked or crowded out, a preliminary competition will be held which will restrict to Nebraskans men. As a result three Nebraska architects have been chosen. To these three have been added seven more of the best known and the most successful architects in large monumental work in the whole country and these men, 10 in number, are about to start on the final competition which will determine who shall design Nebraska's capitol."

Mr. Head then quoted the following opinion of the commission on the kind of building required: "While the commission is very anxious not to handicap competitors, nor to limit the possibilities, it is nevertheless quite clear on much that it seeks to realize in the final result and will certainly be disappointed should the capitol finally erected prove not to be: "A Working Home."

"First. A practical working home for the state governmental machinery, adequate not only for the present needs of the great state of Nebraska, but with provision made or anticipated for further development and growth for a century to come. "Second. An inspiring monument worthy of the state for which it stands; a thing of beauty conceived and fashioned so as to record properly and exploit our aspirations and patriotism, past, present and future; intelligently designed, durably and conscientiously built, and of fittingly set, surrounded, embellished and adequately furnished. "Third. The whole accomplished without friction, scandal, extravagance or waste. A work calculated to inspire pride in the heart of every Nebraskan."

Geneva, Neb., Feb. 20.—(Special)—Two gray wolves were killed yesterday by Walter and Frank Leveque, sons of Robert Leveque, living five miles northwest of Geneva. The howl of wolves at night is heard frequently in the vicinity. The animals are big enough to carry off swine.

## One Cent Drop Postage and Air Mail Service Approved

Washington, Feb. 20.—One-cent postage for local or drop-letters was approved by the senate postoffice committee, which incorporated the reduced postage amendment of Senators Deal, South Carolina, and McKellar, Tennessee, demagogue, in the postoffice appropriation bill.

## Grain Rates to East Ordered Modified By Interstate Body

Washington, Feb. 20.—Modifications of the previous general adjustment of rates on grain from the northwest to Chicago and St. Louis were announced by the interstate commerce commission.

The commission's new conclusion provides that rates on grain shipments by way of Minneapolis to Chicago from Mankato and Rapid City, S. D., and intermediate points be made not to exceed the rates over the direct routes to Chicago from all points on and north of the Chicago and Northwestern railroad to these points. It provides also that St. Louis should be given a proportional rate of 15 cents from Sioux City, the same as is in effect from Sioux City to Chicago.
