# FAMOUS MEXICAN SAY THREAT OF MEXICO PREVENTS

Cirilo Arenas and Caravo, Ringleaders of Disturbers, Are Captured by Troops Under Carranza.

Mexico City, March 1.—Cirilo Arenas, a rebel leader, has been capfured by secret military police at Puebla, according to a telegram from Gov. Alfonso Cabrera of the state of Puebla made public here last night. Arenas was taken into custody when he attempted to enter the city of Puebla after leaving the gulf coast region. About a year ago a brigade of soldiers under comnand of Arenas and protecting the Inter-Ocean railway revolted after Arenas received a large sum for the payment of the troops. Since that time this force has been operating with constantly decreasing success in outlying portions of Puebla and Tlaxcala.

Semi-official reports announce the capture of Marcelo Caravo, in the state of Tamalipas. This bandit has attained considerable notoriety and Gen. Francisco Murguia came to this city for a conference with President Carranza recently relafive to plans for the apprehension

Newspapers here in commenting upon the capture of Arenas and Caravo point out the progress made by the present administration toward "complete pacification of the country" before the July elections and the change in the government. Testimony Because Administration Offers No Protection.

Washington, March 1.—Orders is-sued by the Mexican government that Americans who testify before congressional committees investigating the Mexican situation shall not enter Mexico, have prevented business men in towns on the border from giving valuable information, according to Senator Fall, republic-an, New Mexico, chairman of the subcommittee now holding hearings on the border.

In a letter to F. J. Kearful, counel for the subcommittee, Senator Fall declared witnesses desired at Douglas, Nogales and other American cities would not appear because they "had business in Mexico, and were afraid to testify."

"A deplorable state of affairs exists at Nogales and Douglas," the letter said. "Business men are afraid o testify because of the order of the Mexican government that they should not, after teestifying, go into Mexico, and because the administration has done nothing, so far as they know, except to acquiesce in

Declaring that there was a general feeling among business men in American towns on the border that they should not be called upon to eopardize their business and possioly safety of their employes by testifying, unless given definite assur-ance of protection by the United States government, the letter said that "among certain people the president's note to the senate that congress had no jurisdiction in foreign affairs is being urged as an excuse for their lack of patriotism in giving facts as they know them, even pri-

London, March 1.—(New York Times-Chicago Tribune Cable, Copyright, 1920.)—There is considerable mystery about the reason for Lord Gray's return from Washington to London, and the reported appointment of Sir Auckland Geddes

Lord Grey today refused to discuss the report that he was denied an audience with President Wilson because of the tittle tattle over Maj. Crauford Stuart, and Major Stuart not in London.

Lord Grey, it is said, pointed out that Major Stuart was not a member of the diplomatic staff, but a personal aid. Bajor Stuart, it is said, denied the whole story, and the woman to whom he is alleged to have spoken, made a written denial

that he had done so.

Lord Grey consulted Ambassador
Jusserand, dean of the diplomatic corps, who advised him not to act. The incident closed, according to the London version, on Lord Grey's report to Secretary Lansing that there was no evidence to support the charge against Major Stuart.

While the situation is not now acute, Mr. Daniels said, oil consuming agencies of the government must study their needs in the light of the relation of the supply to the demand if a future shortage of fuel oil was to be avoided.


