The district now under Mr. Larson's supervision would be restricted to Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Idaho and Montana. The 45 liquor sleuths assigned to the northwest district, Mr. Gaylord pointed out, are under one head and may be concentrated at any time for action in any portion of the district where agitation against prohibition may develop.

CALL ON FORMER SERVICE MEN TO BACK PERSHING

Letters Asking Nebraska Ex-Soldiers to Work for A. E. F. Commander For President.

The Nebraska Soldiers' and Sailors' Pershing club, with headquarters at 107 Paxton hotel, Omaha, sent a letter with membership cards enclosed to all the former service men in this state, calling upon them to join the club and help put Nebraska "over the top" for Pershing. Responses are now coming in.

The letter, which bears the signature of sixty odd former Nebraska soldiers, reads: "As one of those who participated in the recent war, it is most fitting and highly important that you be consulted as to the men who are to serve as the officers of the government you fought to maintain."

"Our American Legion and our Veterans of Foreign Wars association are organized for purposes other than political, and, of course, should be kept out of partisan politics. It is essential, however, that as individuals we have our personal preference as to candidates for public office and work with each other to secure their election. Could Not All Serve. "We, the undersigned, were a part of America's army. Most of us served in France as privates or non-coms. Some of us were hated 'save-tans' and others held various rank. Those of us who were held on duty in this country know what pangs of regret swept through every one of you who waited in camp for 'overseas orders' which never came. If you were one of those, you probably felt, just as we did, that something was wrong with this man's army."

Custer Battlefield Highway Advertised At Automobile Show

A total of \$6,000 is now being spent to mark this route, which is 1300 miles long. Following the old trail used by Custer, it passes through or near the picturesque Black Hills, Crystal cave, Devil's Tower, Powder river, the Big Horn mountains, Yellowstone park, Custer battlefield, National cemetery, Crow Agency, Judith Basin, Montana oil fields, Blackfeet Indian reservation, Glacier park.

At the exhibit in the Auditorium folders are being given away containing general information of the route. In addition, the names of those interested are taken, and a little later calendars with the picture of "Custer's Last Fight," and detailed route information, will be mailed them.

Defendant Wins Big Suit Involving Eight Cherries

Humane Society Cares For Neglected Children. The Nebraska Humane society received reports of 280 neglected children during the five months ending February 29, according to a report issued by W. W. Bradley, superintendent. Most of these complaints referred to conditions of immorality in homes, filthy or unsanitary conditions, small children left alone for long periods of time, and some cases involved cruelty.

Attorney's Cry for Fees Is Echo of Peyton Divorce Case. An echo of the Peyton divorce case, which covered a period of years in the district and state supreme courts, is being heard in the municipal court, where John M. Macfarland has brought an action for \$1,000 against Cordelia E. Peyton and Fayette Snyder, for alleged unpaid balance of attorney's fees. The case harks back to 1911. In Mr. Macfarland's bill of particulars appears an item which reads "Consultation and services in matter of Plaza hotel, conference with detectives and attorneys, \$100." Another item reads: "Services in matter of road house at Irvington and conference with detectives, \$100."

Round House Emloye Hangs Self In Cab of Switch Engine. Clint Hezkarman, a roundhouse employe of the Northwestern railroad at Missouri Valley, committed suicide Wednesday by hanging himself in the cab of a switch engine with the bell rope.
