

By CHARLES D. MICHAELS. Chicago, March 16.—Activity and an advance in corn prices to materially higher levels with oats at the highest of the season featured today's grain markets. Enormous covering and profit-taking on the hulge gave a good setback. At the close corn showed a gain of 2 to 3 cents with September leading. Oats were 1 3-8c higher for May and July and 1-8c higher for September, the latter being sold by houses with country connections.

Bears in corn were on the run from the start until near the finish, and while there was a world of long grain sold out by bulls as prices advanced all deliveries sold at new high figures on the crop with the exception of the May. The latter was the highest since August 1, when sales were made at \$1.61\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ March closed at the top, \$1.63\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ while the deferred deliveries were off 1611\text{.}\$ from the best figures with May \$1.55\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ July \$1.48\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ and September \$1.44\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ Low grades of spring wheat advanced \$26\text{.}\$ cw hile winters were up a like amount with No. 2 hard \$2.43\text{.}\$ No. 2 red \$2.45\text{.}\$ and No. 4 northern \$2.25\text{.}\$ Exporters bid \$2.64 for No. 2 hard, track, New York, prompt shipment on the same as the previous day.

Short covering in volume was on in oats, and with corn strong and premiuma in the sample market, the highest on the crop prices advanced to new high levels for all deliveries. Profit-taking made a moderate recession toward the last, May closing at \$5\footnote{1}\text{.}\$ July at \$7.8\text{.}\$ and September at 69c.

Activity in other grains counted heavily against rye, and profit-taking at \$1.75\text{.}\$ for May filled up buyers and made a slightly lower close. No. 2 on spot was 1c over May with sales at \$1.76\text{.}\$ 1.76\text{.}\$ Barley—Firm for choice, and easy for
